## Associations of "Employing" (30 Words)

<b>applicant</b>	A person who makes a formal application for something, especially a job. <i><b>Applicants</b> for the degree course.</i>
<b>application</b>	Sustained effort; hard work. <i>December 31 is the deadline for <b>applications</b>.</i>
<b>apply</b>	Apply to a surface. <i>You need to <b>apply</b> to the local authority for a grant.</i>
<b>clerk</b>	Work as a clerk as in the legal business. <i>Eleven of those who left college this year are <b>clerking</b> in auction stores.</i>
<b>contracted</b>	Reduced in size or pulled together. <i>The <b>contracted</b> pupils of her eyes.</i>
<b>coordinator</b>	Someone whose task is to see that work goes harmoniously. <i>A full time <b>coordinator</b> was appointed to oversee the referral process.</i>
<b>employed</b>	(of a person) having a paid job. <i>Most of our graduates are <b>employed</b>.</i>
<b>employee</b>	A person employed for wages or salary, especially at non-executive level.
<b>employment</b>	The act of giving someone a job. <i>He is looking for <b>employment</b>.</i>
<b>headhunter</b>	A savage who cuts off and preserves the heads of enemies as trophies. <i>A <b>headhunter</b> offering you a wonderful new position at a higher salary.</i>
<b>hire</b>	A newly hired employee. <i>He signed up for a week s car <b>hire</b>.</i>
<b>indenture</b>	The state of being bound to service by an indenture. <i>An <b>indentured</b> servant.</i>
<a href="#">interview</a>	Perform well or badly at an interview. <i>A half hour <b>interview</b> with the prime minister.</i>
<b>lackey</b>	A male servant (especially a footman). <i><b>Lackeys</b> were waiting to help them from the carriage.</i>

<b><u>mercenary</u></b>	A professional soldier hired to serve in a foreign army. <i>Cricket s most infamous <b>mercenary</b>.</i>
<b><u>occupation</u></b>	Any activity that occupies a person's attention. <i>He missed the bell in his <b>occupation</b> with the computer game.</i>
<b><u>profession</u></b>	A body of people engaged in a particular profession. <i>The legal <b>profession</b> has become increasingly business conscious.</i>
<b>proletarian</b>	A member of the working class (not necessarily employed). <i>A <b>proletarian</b> ideology.</i>
<b>recruiter</b>	An official who enlists personnel for military service. <i>A <b>recruiter</b> will schedule you for an interview.</i>
<b>recruitment</b>	The act of getting recruits; enlisting people for the army (or for a job or a cause etc). <i>Inflammatory cell <b>recruitment</b>.</i>
<b>secretarial</b>	Of or relating to a secretary or to a secretary's work. <i><b>Secretarial</b> skills.</i>
<b>semiskilled</b>	Possessing or requiring limited skills. <i><b>Semiskilled</b> dockworkers.</i>
<b><u>staff</u></b>	Serve on the staff of. <i>The Polish General and his <b>staff</b>.</i>
<b>subcontract</b>	Work under a subcontract engage in a subcontract. <i>We would <b>subcontract</b> the translation work out.</i>
<b>subcontractor</b>	A firm or person that carries out work for a company as part of a larger project.
<b>vocation</b>	A person's employment or main occupation, especially regarded as worthy and requiring dedication. <i>GNVQs in Leisure and Tourism will be the introduction to a wide span of <b>vocations</b>.</i>
<b>workaholic</b>	A person who compulsively works excessively hard and long hours.
<b>worker</b>	A member of the working class (not necessarily employed). <i>A red flag with the inscription <b>workers</b> of the world unite.</i>
<b><u>workforce</u></b>	The force of workers available. <i>A quarter of Galway s manufacturing <b>workforce</b> are being put out of a job.</i>
<b>working</b>	Adopted as a temporary basis for further work. <i>A <b>working</b> draft.</i>
