Definitions of "Employs" as a noun

employment The action of giving work to someone.
*A fall in the numbers in full time **employment**.*



Usage Examples of "Employs" as a noun

- *He was in the employ of the city.*
- *They are looking for employment.*



Employs as a Verb

Definitions of "Employs" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "employs" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Put into service; make work or employ for a particular purpose or for its inherent or natural purpose.*
- *Engage or hire for work.*



Synonyms of "Employs" as a verb (6 Words)

apply Apply oneself to.
*You need to **apply** to the local authority for a grant.*

engage Engage for service under a term of contract.
*Organizations **engage** in a variety of activities.*

hire Engage or hire for work.
*Management **hired** and fired labour in line with demand.*

use Use up consume fully.
*She still **used** her maiden name professionally.*


utilise Put into service; make work or employ for a particular purpose or for its inherent or natural purpose.

utilize Make practical and effective use of.
*How do you **utilize** this tool.*



Usage Examples of "Employs" as a verb

- *How many people has she employed?*



Associations of "Employs" (30 Words)

- applicant** A person who makes a formal application for something, especially a job.
*A job **applicant**.*
- application** The action of applying something to a surface.
*The doctor prescribed a topical **application** of iodine.*
- apply** Apply oneself to.
*I **apply** this rule to get good results.*
- clerk** Work as a clerk.
*A bank **clerk**.*
- contracted** Reduced in size or pulled together.
*The **contracted** pupils of her eyes.*
- coordinator** A person whose job is to organize events or activities and to negotiate with others in order to ensure they work together effectively.
*Subordinate clauses can be connected with a **coordinator**.*

employed	(of a person) having a paid job. <i>Up to 40 per cent of employed people are in part time jobs.</i>
employee	A person employed for wages or salary, especially at non-executive level.
employment	The action of giving work to someone. <i>He travelled in a variety of employments.</i>
headhunter	A person who identifies and approaches suitable candidates employed elsewhere to fill business positions. <i>A headhunter offering you a wonderful new position at a higher salary.</i>
hire	A newly hired employee. <i>Wilmot hired a private detective to follow him.</i>
indenture	Bind by or as if by indentures as of an apprentice or servant. <i>Indentured labourers.</i>
<u>interview</u>	Go for an interview in the hope of being hired. <i>Police are keen to interview two men seen nearby.</i>
lackey	Behave in a servile way towards (someone). <i>Lackeys were waiting to help them from the carriage.</i>
<u>mercenary</u>	A person primarily motivated by personal gain. <i>Mercenary killers.</i>
<u>occupation</u>	A job or profession. <i>People in professional occupations.</i>
<u>profession</u>	A body of people engaged in a particular profession. <i>A profession of Christianity.</i>
proletarian	A member of the proletariat. <i>They are true proletarians.</i>
recruiter	Someone who supplies members or employees. <i>A recruiter will schedule you for an interview.</i>
recruitment	The increase in a natural population as progeny grow and new members arrive. <i>This was a deterrent to the recruitment of nurses.</i>
secretarial	Relating to the work or position of a secretary. <i>A secretarial job.</i>
semiskilled	Possessing or requiring limited skills. <i>A semiskilled job.</i>
<u>staff</u>	Serve on the staff of. <i>The dean addressed the letter to the entire staff of the university.</i>
subcontract	Work under a subcontract engage in a subcontract. <i>We would subcontract the translation work out.</i>

- subcontractor** Someone who enters into a subcontract with the primary contractor.
- vocation** A trade or profession.
*Not all of us have a **vocation** to be nurses or doctors.*
- workaholic** Person with a compulsive need to work.
- worker** A member of the working class (not necessarily employed).
*He s a miracle **worker**.*
- workforce** The force of workers available.
*A quarter of Galway s manufacturing **workforce** are being put out of a job.*
- working** The action of doing work.
*They need **working** agreements with their neighbor states on interstate projects.*
