## Synonyms of "Employs" as a noun (1 Word)

**employment** The action of giving work to someone.  
*A fall in the numbers in full time **employment**.*



## Usage Examples of "Employs" as a noun

- *They are looking for employment.*



## Employs as a Verb

### Definitions of "Employs" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "employs" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Put into service; make work or employ for a particular purpose or for its inherent or natural purpose.*
- *Engage or hire for work.*



### Synonyms of "Employs" as a verb (6 Words)

**apply** Apply oneself to.  
*You need to **apply** to the local authority for a grant.*

**engage** Engage for service under a term of contract.  
*Organizations **engage** in a variety of activities.*

**hire** Engage or hire for work.  
*Management **hired** and fired labour in line with demand.*

**use** Use up consume fully.  
*She still **used** her maiden name professionally.*

**utilise** Put into service; make work or employ for a particular purpose or for its inherent or natural purpose.

**utilize** Make practical and effective use of.  
*How do you **utilize** this tool.*



## Usage Examples of "Employs" as a verb

- *How many people has she employed?*



## Associations of "Employs" (30 Words)

- applicant** A person who makes a formal application for something, especially a job.  
*A job **applicant**.*
- application** The action of applying something to a surface.  
*The doctor prescribed a topical **application** of iodine.*
- apply** Apply oneself to.  
*I **apply** this rule to get good results.*
- clerk** Work as a clerk.  
*A bank **clerk**.*
- contracted** Reduced in size or pulled together.  
*The **contracted** pupils of her eyes.*
- coordinator** A person whose job is to organize events or activities and to negotiate with others in order to ensure they work together effectively.  
*Subordinate clauses can be connected with a **coordinator**.*

<b>employed</b>	(of a person) having a paid job. <i>Up to 40 per cent of <b>employed</b> people are in part time jobs.</i>
<b>employee</b>	A person employed for wages or salary, especially at non-executive level.
<b>employment</b>	The action of giving work to someone. <i>He travelled in a variety of <b>employments</b>.</i>
<b>headhunter</b>	A person who identifies and approaches suitable candidates employed elsewhere to fill business positions. <i>A <b>headhunter</b> offering you a wonderful new position at a higher salary.</i>
<b>hire</b>	A newly hired employee. <i>Wilmot <b>hired</b> a private detective to follow him.</i>
<b>indenture</b>	Bind by or as if by indentures as of an apprentice or servant. <i><b>Indentured</b> labourers.</i>
<a href="#"><u>interview</u></a>	Go for an interview in the hope of being hired. <i>Police are keen to <b>interview</b> two men seen nearby.</i>
<b>lackey</b>	Behave in a servile way towards (someone). <i><b>Lackeys</b> were waiting to help them from the carriage.</i>
<a href="#"><u>mercenary</u></a>	A person primarily motivated by personal gain. <i><b>Mercenary</b> killers.</i>
<a href="#"><u>occupation</u></a>	A job or profession. <i>People in professional <b>occupations</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>profession</u></a>	A body of people engaged in a particular profession. <i>A <b>profession</b> of Christianity.</i>
<b>proletarian</b>	A member of the proletariat. <i>They are true <b>proletarians</b>.</i>
<b>recruiter</b>	Someone who supplies members or employees. <i>A <b>recruiter</b> will schedule you for an interview.</i>
<b>recruitment</b>	The increase in a natural population as progeny grow and new members arrive. <i>This was a deterrent to the <b>recruitment</b> of nurses.</i>
<b>secretarial</b>	Relating to the work or position of a secretary. <i>A <b>secretarial</b> job.</i>
<b>semiskilled</b>	Possessing or requiring limited skills. <i>A <b>semiskilled</b> job.</i>
<a href="#"><u>staff</u></a>	Serve on the staff of. <i>The dean addressed the letter to the entire <b>staff</b> of the university.</i>
<b>subcontract</b>	Work under a subcontract engage in a subcontract. <i>We would <b>subcontract</b> the translation work out.</i>



- subcontractor** Someone who enters into a subcontract with the primary contractor.
- vocation** A trade or profession.  
*Not all of us have a **vocation** to be nurses or doctors.*
- workaholic** Person with a compulsive need to work.
- worker** A member of the working class (not necessarily employed).  
*He s a miracle **worker**.*
- workforce** The force of workers available.  
*A quarter of Galway s manufacturing **workforce** are being put out of a job.*
- working** The action of doing work.  
*They need **working** agreements with their neighbor states on interstate projects.*
