<b>fair</b>	Gathering of producers to promote business. <i>She won a blue ribbon for her baking at the county <b>fair</b>.</i>
<b>flea market</b>	Any wingless bloodsucking parasitic insect noted for ability to leap.
<a href="#"><u>marketplace</u></a>	An area in a town where a public mercantile establishment is set up. <i>They were driven from the <b>marketplace</b>.</i>
<b>mart</b>	An area in a town where a public mercantile establishment is set up. <i>A liquor <b>mart</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>outlet</u></a>	A shop that sells goods made by a particular manufacturer at discounted prices. <i>A designer <b>outlet</b>.</i>
<b>piazza</b>	A public square or marketplace, especially in an Italian town.

<b>plaza</b>	Mercantile establishment consisting of a carefully landscaped complex of shops representing leading merchandisers; usually includes restaurants and a convenient parking area; a modern version of the traditional marketplace. <i>A good <b>plaza</b> should have a movie house.</i>
<b>reseller</b>	A person or company that sells something they have bought to someone else. <i>Products are sold both directly and through <b>resellers</b>.</i>
<b>retail outlet</b>	The selling of goods to consumers; usually in small quantities and not for resale.
<b>shop</b>	A place where things are manufactured or repaired a workshop. <i>She slogged her way round the supermarket doing the weekly <b>shop</b>.</i>
<b>shopping centre</b>	Searching for or buying goods or services.
<u><a href="#">store</a></u>	A shop of any size or kind. <i>A <b>store</b> manager.</i>

<b>deficit</b>	A deficiency or failing, especially in a neurological or psychological function. <i>Last year there was a serious budgetary <b>deficit</b>.</i>
<b>export</b>	Of a high standard suitable for export. <i>The Russians <b>exported</b> Marxism to Africa.</i>
<b>exporter</b>	A person or group spreading or introducing ideas and beliefs to another country. <i>Brazil is the world s largest producer and <b>exporter</b> of sugar.</i>
<b>hype</b>	Promote or publicize (a product or idea) intensively, often exaggerating its benefits. <i>An industry quick to <b>hype</b> its products.</i>
<b>importer</b>	A person or organization that brings goods or services into a country from abroad for sale. <i>The EU is the largest <b>importer</b> of agricultural products from developing countries.</i>
<b>market</b>	A stock market. <i>They wanted to browse around the street <b>market</b>.</i>
<b>marketing</b>	The commercial processes involved in promoting and selling and distributing a product or service. <i>A <b>marketing</b> campaign.</i>

<b>mercantile</b>	Of or relating to the economic system of mercantilism. <i>Preached a <b>mercantile</b> and militant patriotism.</i>
<b>mercantilism</b>	The economic theory that trade generates wealth and is stimulated by the accumulation of profitable balances, which a government should encourage by means of protectionism.
<b>merchandise</b>	Promote or publicize (an idea or person). <i>Shops which offered an astonishing range of <b>merchandise</b>.</i>
<b>merchandising</b>	The exchange of goods for an agreed sum of money. <i>The characters are still popular and found on a wide variety of <b>merchandising</b>.</i>
<u><a href="#">merchant</a></u>	In historical contexts relating to merchants or commerce. <i>A builders <b>merchant</b>.</i>
<b>protectionism</b>	The policy of imposing duties or quotas on imports in order to protect home industries from overseas competition.
<b>salesclerk</b>	A salesperson in a store.
<b>sell</b>	An act of selling or attempting to sell something. <i>If she was going to <b>sell</b> herself then it would be as well not to come too cheap.</i>
<b>shop</b>	A place where things are manufactured or repaired a workshop. <i>The machine <b>shop</b>.</i>
<b>shopper</b>	A bag for holding shopping, that is attached to wheels and pushed or pulled along. <i>A four wheeled tartan <b>shopper</b>.</i>
<u><a href="#">swap</a></u>	Move (a piece of a program) into memory, in computer science. <i>Let s do a <b>swap</b>.</i>
<b>tariff</b>	Charge a tariff. <i><b>Tariff</b> imported goods.</i>
<u><a href="#">trade</a></u>	A trade wind. <i>The stock <b>traded</b> around 20 a share.</i>
<b>trader</b>	A merchant ship.
<b>transact</b>	Conduct or carry out (business). <i>The dealer must know the price at which he is prepared to <b>transact</b>.</i>
<b>vend</b>	Sell (something). <i>The company makes and <b>vends</b> environmentally friendly beauty products.</i>
