- *A centre of commerce; a market.*

bazaar	A shop where a variety of goods are sold. <i>The church bazaar.</i>
boutique	A business or establishment that is small and sophisticated or fashionable. <i>California's boutique wineries.</i>
department store	A specialized sphere of knowledge.
fair	Gathering of producers to promote business. <i>She won a blue ribbon for her baking at the county fair.</i>
flea market	Any wingless bloodsucking parasitic insect noted for ability to leap.
<u>marketplace</u>	An area in a town where a public mercantile establishment is set up. <i>They were driven from the marketplace.</i>
mart	An area in a town where a public mercantile establishment is set up. <i>A liquor mart.</i>
<u>outlet</u>	A shop that sells goods made by a particular manufacturer at discounted prices. <i>A designer outlet.</i>
piazza	A public square or marketplace, especially in an Italian town.

plaza	Mercantile establishment consisting of a carefully landscaped complex of shops representing leading merchandisers; usually includes restaurants and a convenient parking area; a modern version of the traditional marketplace. <i>A good plaza should have a movie house.</i>
reseller	A person or company that sells something they have bought to someone else. <i>Products are sold both directly and through resellers.</i>
retail outlet	The selling of goods to consumers; usually in small quantities and not for resale.
shop	A place where things are manufactured or repaired a workshop. <i>She slogged her way round the supermarket doing the weekly shop.</i>
shopping centre	Searching for or buying goods or services.
<u>store</u>	A shop of any size or kind. <i>A store manager.</i>

barter	The action or system of bartering. <i>They were able to buy or barter for most of what they needed.</i>
business	Business concerns collectively. <i>He bought his brother s business.</i>
capitalism	An economic and political system in which a country's trade and industry are controlled by private owners for profit, rather than by the state. <i>Private ownership is a key feature of capitalism.</i>
commerce	Social exchange, especially of opinions, attitudes, etc. <i>The noise and warmth of human commerce.</i>
commercial	Of or relating to commercialism. <i>Commercial diamonds.</i>
commercially	In a way that is concerned with buying, selling, and making a profit. <i>Kiwi fruit is now also grown commercially.</i>
dealing	A personal connection or association with someone. <i>Share dealings.</i>
deficit	A deficiency or failing, especially in a neurological or psychological function. <i>Last year there was a serious budgetary deficit.</i>
export	Of a high standard suitable for export. <i>The Russians exported Marxism to Africa.</i>
exporter	A person or group spreading or introducing ideas and beliefs to another country. <i>Brazil is the world s largest producer and exporter of sugar.</i>
hype	Promote or publicize (a product or idea) intensively, often exaggerating its benefits. <i>An industry quick to hype its products.</i>
importer	A person or organization that brings goods or services into a country from abroad for sale. <i>The EU is the largest importer of agricultural products from developing countries.</i>
market	A stock market. <i>They wanted to browse around the street market.</i>
marketing	The commercial processes involved in promoting and selling and distributing a product or service. <i>A marketing campaign.</i>

mercantile	Of or relating to the economic system of mercantilism. <i>Preached a mercantile and militant patriotism.</i>
mercantilism	The economic theory that trade generates wealth and is stimulated by the accumulation of profitable balances, which a government should encourage by means of protectionism.
merchandise	Promote or publicize (an idea or person). <i>Shops which offered an astonishing range of merchandise.</i>
merchandising	The exchange of goods for an agreed sum of money. <i>The characters are still popular and found on a wide variety of merchandising.</i>
<u>merchant</u>	In historical contexts relating to merchants or commerce. <i>A builders merchant.</i>
protectionism	The policy of imposing duties or quotas on imports in order to protect home industries from overseas competition.
salesclerk	A salesperson in a store.
sell	An act of selling or attempting to sell something. <i>If she was going to sell herself then it would be as well not to come too cheap.</i>
shop	A place where things are manufactured or repaired a workshop. <i>The machine shop.</i>
shopper	A bag for holding shopping, that is attached to wheels and pushed or pulled along. <i>A four wheeled tartan shopper.</i>
<u>swap</u>	Move (a piece of a program) into memory, in computer science. <i>Let s do a swap.</i>
tariff	Charge a tariff. <i>Tariff imported goods.</i>
<u>trade</u>	A trade wind. <i>The stock traded around 20 a share.</i>
trader	A merchant ship.
transact	Conduct or carry out (business). <i>The dealer must know the price at which he is prepared to transact.</i>
vend	Sell (something). <i>The company makes and vends environmentally friendly beauty products.</i>
