- Match or surpass (a person or achievement), typically by imitation.
- Reproduce the function or action of (a different computer, software system, etc.
- Imitate.
- Strive to equal or match, especially by imitating.

follow	Come as a logical consequence follow logically. She follow ed a guru for years.
imitate	Take or follow as a model. She imitate d my Scots accent.
<u>mimic</u>	(of a drug) replicate the physiological effects of (another substance. <i>Tiger beetles are mimicked by grasshoppers.</i>
mirror	Reflect as if in a mirror. His own views mirror ed those of his followers.



model oneself on	Plan or create according to a model or models.	
parrot	Repeat mechanically. Encouraging students to parrot back information.	
reproduce	Make a copy or equivalent of. This DVD player reproduce s the sound of the piano very well.	
simulate	Make a pretence of. <i>Red ochre intended to simulate blood.</i>	
take as a model	Take somebody somewhere.	
take as an example Lay claim to; as of an idea.

<u>imitation</u>	Not genuine or real being an imitation of the genuine article. Decorated with imitation palm leaves.
imitator	Someone who copies the words or behavior of another. The show s success has sparked off many imitator s.
iterate	Run or be performed again. <i>The function iterates.</i>
likeness	Similarity in appearance or character or nature between persons or things. <i>Humans are described as being made in God s likeness.</i>
<u>microcosm</u>	Humankind regarded as the representation in miniature of the universe. The city is a microcosm of modern Malaysia.
mime	A theatrical performance using mime. <i>He s a very fine actor and mime artist.</i>
mimesis	The imitative representation of nature and human behavior in art and literature. Barth has always detached his use of plot from mimesis .
mimetic	Exhibiting mimicry- R.W.Hamilton. <i>Mimetic patterns in butterflies.</i>
<u>mimic</u>	An animal or plant that mimics another. <i>How did these insects evolve to become such perfect mimics.</i>
pantomime	A theatrical entertainment, mainly for children, which involves music, topical jokes, and slapstick comedy and is based on a fairy tale or nursery story, usually produced around Christmas. <i>The drive to town was a pantomime</i> .
parrot	A bird, often vividly coloured, with a short downcurved hooked bill, grasping feet, and a raucous voice, found especially in the tropics and feeding on fruits and seeds. Many are popular as cage birds, and some are able to mimic the human voice. <i>The students parroted the teacher s words.</i>
pastiche	An artistic work in a style that imitates that of another work, artist, or period. <i>The songs amount to much more than blatant pastiche.</i>
photocopy	Make a photocopy of. You can photocopy the entry form.
plagiarize	Take without referencing from someone else's writing or speech; of intellectual property. <i>The author claims she was plagiarized</i> .



<u>replica</u>	An exact copy or model of something, especially one on a smaller scale. It is a replica of an antique plaque.
<u>replicate</u>	A close or exact copy; a replica. <i>He could never replicate his brilliant performance of the magic trick.</i>
replication	The repetition of a scientific experiment or trial to obtain a consistent result. A twentieth century building would be cheaper than a replication of what was there before.
reproduce	Produce a copy of. His works are reproduce d on postcards and posters.
reproducible	Able to be reproduced or copied. <i>Reproducible laboratory experiments.</i>
<u>resemble</u>	Have a similar appearance to or qualities in common with (someone or something); look or seem like. They resemble d each other closely.
<u>sample</u>	Take a sample of. Investigations involved analysing sample s of handwriting.
simulate	Produce a computer model of. Future population changes were simulate d by computer.
triplicate	Existing in three copies or examples. <i>Triplicate</i> measurements.
