Associations of "Emulates" (30 Words)

copy	Reproduce or make an exact copy of. <i>Copy that drawing.</i>
dissemble	Make believe with the intent to deceive. <i>An honest sincere person with no need to dissemble.</i>
duplicate	Make a duplicate or duplicates of. <i>He made a duplicate for the files.</i>
echo	Ring or echo with sound. <i>The cheese has a sharp rich aftertaste with echoes of salty earthy pastures.</i>
facsimile	Send something via a facsimile machine. <i>The ride was facsimiled for another theme park.</i>
fax	The production or transmission of faxes. <i>The equipment consists of four word processors a fax and a photocopier.</i>
imitate	Copy (a person’s speech or mannerisms), especially for comic effect. <i>Life imitate art.</i>
imitation	Not genuine or real being an imitation of the genuine article. <i>An imitation sub machine gun.</i>
imitator	Someone who (fraudulently) assumes the appearance of another. <i>The show s success has sparked off many imitators.</i>
iterate	To say, state, or perform again. <i>The function iterates.</i>
likeness	The fact or quality of being alike; resemblance. <i>The only known likeness of Dorothy as a young woman.</i>
microcosm	A miniature model of something. <i>The belief in correspondences between the Universe and Man between microcosm and macrocosm.</i>
mime	A theatrical performance using mime. <i>The acting students mimed eating an apple.</i>

mimesis	Imitative representation of the real world in art and literature. <i>Culture is organized in terms of mimesis and desire.</i>
mimetic	Exhibiting mimicry- R.W.Hamilton. <i>The mimetic tendency of infancy.</i>
<u>mimic</u>	An animal or plant that mimics another. <i>She mimicked Eileen's pedantic voice.</i>
pantomime	Act out without words but with gestures and bodily movements only. <i>He made a pantomime of checking his watch.</i>
parrot	Usually brightly colored zygodactyl tropical birds with short hooked beaks and the ability to mimic sounds. <i>Encouraging students to parrot back information.</i>
pastiche	A work of art that imitates the style of some previous work. <i>The songs amount to much more than blatant pastiche.</i>
photocopy	Make a photocopy of. <i>You can photocopy the entry form.</i>
plagiarize	Take (the work or an idea of someone else) and pass it off as one's own. <i>The author claims she was plagiarized.</i>
<u>replica</u>	A duplicate of an original artistic work. <i>A replica of the Empire State Building.</i>
<u>replicate</u>	Make or do or perform again. <i>These findings have been replicated by Metzger and Antes.</i>
replication	A copy. <i>Scientists will not believe an experimental result until they have seen at least one replication.</i>
reproduce	Make a copy or equivalent of. <i>These bacteria reproduce.</i>
reproducible	Capable of being reproduced. <i>Reproducible laboratory experiments.</i>
<u>resemble</u>	Appear like; be similar or bear a likeness to. <i>They resembled each other closely.</i>
<u>sample</u>	Take a sample or samples of something for analysis. <i>Riffs sampled from other musicians.</i>
simulate	Reproduce someone's behavior or looks. <i>Red ochre intended to simulate blood.</i>
triplicate	Reproduce threefold. <i>The triplicate of a letter to the Governor.</i>
