## Associations of "Emulates" (30 Words)

<b>copy</b>	Reproduce or make an exact copy of. <i>Copy that drawing.</i>
<b>dissemble</b>	Make believe with the intent to deceive. <i>An honest sincere person with no need to <b>dissemble</b>.</i>
<b>duplicate</b>	Make a duplicate or duplicates of. <i>He made a <b>duplicate</b> for the files.</i>
<b>echo</b>	Ring or echo with sound. <i>The cheese has a sharp rich aftertaste with <b>echoes</b> of salty earthy pastures.</i>
<b>facsimile</b>	Send something via a facsimile machine. <i>The ride was <b>facsimiled</b> for another theme park.</i>
<b>fax</b>	The production or transmission of faxes. <i>The equipment consists of four word processors a <b>fax</b> and a photocopier.</i>
<b>imitate</b>	Copy (a person’s speech or mannerisms), especially for comic effect. <i>Life <b>imitate</b> art.</i>
<b>imitation</b>	Not genuine or real being an imitation of the genuine article. <i>An <b>imitation</b> sub machine gun.</i>
<b>imitator</b>	Someone who (fraudulently) assumes the appearance of another. <i>The show s success has sparked off many <b>imitators</b>.</i>
<b>iterate</b>	To say, state, or perform again. <i>The function <b>iterates</b>.</i>
<b>likeness</b>	The fact or quality of being alike; resemblance. <i>The only known <b>likeness</b> of Dorothy as a young woman.</i>
<b>microcosm</b>	A miniature model of something. <i>The belief in correspondences between the Universe and Man between <b>microcosm</b> and macrocosm.</i>
<b>mime</b>	A theatrical performance using mime. <i>The acting students <b>mimed</b> eating an apple.</i>

<b>mimesis</b>	Imitative representation of the real world in art and literature. <i>Culture is organized in terms of <b>mimesis</b> and desire.</i>
<b>mimetic</b>	Exhibiting mimicry- R.W.Hamilton. <i>The <b>mimetic</b> tendency of infancy.</i>
<b><u>mimic</u></b>	An animal or plant that mimics another. <i>She <b>mimicked</b> Eileen's pedantic voice.</i>
<b>pantomime</b>	Act out without words but with gestures and bodily movements only. <i>He made a <b>pantomime</b> of checking his watch.</i>
<b>parrot</b>	Usually brightly colored zygodactyl tropical birds with short hooked beaks and the ability to mimic sounds. <i>Encouraging students to <b>parrot</b> back information.</i>
<b>pastiche</b>	A work of art that imitates the style of some previous work. <i>The songs amount to much more than blatant <b>pastiche</b>.</i>
<b>photocopy</b>	Make a photocopy of. <i>You can <b>photocopy</b> the entry form.</i>
<b>plagiarize</b>	Take (the work or an idea of someone else) and pass it off as one's own. <i>The author claims she was <b>plagiarized</b>.</i>
<b><u>replica</u></b>	A duplicate of an original artistic work. <i>A <b>replica</b> of the Empire State Building.</i>
<b><u>replicate</u></b>	Make or do or perform again. <i>These findings have been <b>replicated</b> by Metzger and Antes.</i>
<b>replication</b>	A copy. <i>Scientists will not believe an experimental result until they have seen at least one <b>replication</b>.</i>
<b>reproduce</b>	Make a copy or equivalent of. <i>These bacteria <b>reproduce</b>.</i>
<b>reproducible</b>	Capable of being reproduced. <i><b>Reproducible</b> laboratory experiments.</i>
<b><u>resemble</u></b>	Appear like; be similar or bear a likeness to. <i>They <b>resembled</b> each other closely.</i>
<b><u>sample</u></b>	Take a sample or samples of something for analysis. <i>Riffs <b>sampled</b> from other musicians.</i>
<b>simulate</b>	Reproduce someone's behavior or looks. <i>Red ochre intended to <b>simulate</b> blood.</i>
<b>triplicate</b>	Reproduce threefold. <i>The <b>triplicate</b> of a letter to the Governor.</i>
