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## Associations of "Enacting" (30 Words)

<a href="#">adopt</a>	(of a local authority) accept responsibility for the maintenance of (a road). <i>This approach has been <b>adopted</b> by many big banks.</i>
<a href="#">amendment</a>	Something which is added to soil in order to improve its texture or fertility. <i>You can add some soil texturizing <b>amendments</b> to improve soil drainage.</i>
<b>appoint</b>	Assign a duty, responsibility or obligation to. <i>They <b>appointed</b> her as personnel manager.</i>
<b>attorney</b>	A solicitor.
<b>chaplain</b>	A member of the clergy attached to a private chapel, institution, ship, regiment, etc. <i>A prison <b>chaplain</b>.</i>
<b>clergy</b>	In Christianity clergymen collectively as distinguished from the laity. <i>All marriages were to be solemnized by the <b>clergy</b>.</i>
<a href="#">council</a>	Denoting housing provided by a local council at a subsidized rent. <i>That evening she held a family <b>council</b>.</i>
<a href="#">curate</a>	A minister with pastoral responsibility.
<a href="#">decree</a>	Issue a decree. <i>Presidential <b>decrees</b>.</i>
<b>enactment</b>	Acting the part of a character on stage; dramatically representing the character by speech and action and gesture. <i>The <b>enactment</b> of equal pay legislation.</i>
<b>enforcement</b>	The act of enforcing; ensuring observance of or obedience to. <i>The strict <b>enforcement</b> of environmental regulations.</i>
<b>extraterritorial</b>	(of a law or decree) valid outside a country's territory. <i>Foreign embassies have <b>extraterritorial</b> rights.</i>
<b>federal</b>	Any federal law enforcement officer. <i><b>Federal</b> courts.</i>

<b>jurisdiction</b>	In law; the territory within which power can be exercised. <i>Several different tax <b>jurisdictions</b>.</i>
<b>law</b>	Statute law and the common law. <i>The <b>law</b> came looking for him.</i>
<b>legal</b>	Having legal efficacy or force. <i>The European <b>legal</b> system.</i>
<b>legislate</b>	Make laws, bills, etc. or bring into effect by legislation. <i>You cannot <b>legislate</b> for bad luck like that.</i>
<b>legislation</b>	The process of making or enacting laws. <i>It will require <b>legislation</b> to change this situation.</i>
<b>minister</b>	Administer a sacrament. <i>The story was able to <b>minister</b> true consolation.</i>
<b>nominate</b>	Put forward nominate for appointment to an office or for an honor or position. <i>The President <b>nominated</b> her as head of the Civil Rights Commission.</i>
<b>ordain</b>	Order (something) officially. <i>Equal punishment was <b>ordained</b> for the two crimes.</i>
<b>ordinance</b>	A statute enacted by a city government. <i>They issued an <b>ordinance</b> limiting the length of nets.</i>
<b>pastor</b>	Be pastor of a church or congregation. <i>He continued to study law while <b>pastoring</b> in Chelsea.</i>
<b>prescript</b>	An ordinance, law, or command.
<b>priest</b>	Ordain to the priesthood. <i>The plays were performed within the sacred area of Dionysus in the presence of his <b>priest</b>.</i>
<b>reenact</b>	Enact again. <i>She <b>reenacted</b> what had happened earlier that day.</i>
<b>regulation</b>	Prescribed by or according to regulation. <i>Short haircuts were the <b>regulation</b>.</i>
<b>rule</b>	Mark or draw with a ruler. <i>The <b>rules</b> of cricket.</i>
<b>statute</b>	A written law passed by a legislative body. <i>The Act consolidated <b>statutes</b> dealing with non fatal offences.</i>
<b>statutory</b>	Having come to be required or expected through being done or made regularly. <i><b>Statutory</b> restrictions.</i>
