• Covered or protected with or as if with a case.






Synonyms of "Encased" as an adjective (2 Words)

absolutely With no qualification, restriction, or limitation; totally.

 $He \ {\it absolutely} \ adores \ that \ car.$

altogether With everything considered (and neglecting details.

It was not **altogether** her fault.

collectively As a group; as a whole.

The vast range of resources that the American people **collectively** own.

Totally; utterly.

completely

It was completely different from what we expected.

<u>comprise</u>
Make up or constitute (a whole.

The land he conquered **comprise**d several provinces.



conclusively In a way that is achieved easily or by a large margin.

I have shown **conclusively** that there was no such epidemic.

coverThe protective covering on the front back and spine of a book.

He **cover**ed left field.

The act of protecting something by covering it.

covering A vinyl floor covering.

decisively In a manner that settles an issue convincingly or produces a definite result.

Samples from his body proved **decisively** that he was poisoned.

encircle Form a circle around; surround.

The town is **encircle**d by fortified walls.

enclose Enclose or enfold completely with or as if with a covering.

The lamp was **enclose**d in a frosted glass globe.

Include in scope; include as part of something broader; have as one's sphere

or territory.

encompass
This group encompasses a wide range of people from different

backgrounds.

entirely Without any others being included or involved.

The traffic seemed to consist **entirely** of black cabs.

(of troops) surround (an enemy force.

envelop Foq enveloped the house.

environ Surround; enclose.

The stone circle was **environ**ed by an expanse of peat soil.

of purchase orders that have been filled.

Theirs was a house **filled** with laughter.

generic Lacking imagination or individuality; predictable and unoriginal.

Substituting **generic**s for brand name drugs.

include Specifically exclude someone from a group or activity.

The price **include**s dinner bed and breakfast.

perfectly

In a perfect or faultless way.

Perfectly clean glass bottles.

seal Affix a seal to.

Seal the letter.

securely In a fixed or stable manner.

He is **securely** employed.

shroud Form a cover like a shroud.

They operate behind a **shroud** of secrecy.



stark Completely.

The dragoons were **stark** fellows.

surround The area encircling something surroundings. *The hotel is surrounded by its own gardens.*

thoroughly Completely and absolutely good is sometimes used informally for thoroughly.

He searched the house thoroughly.

Used to emphasize a clause or statement.

A **totally** new situation.

undeniably Used to emphasize that something cannot be denied or disputed.

The results were **undeniably** impressive.

utterly Completely and without qualification; used informally as intensifiers.

He looked **utterly** ridiculous.

Fixed and absolute and without contingency.

A vested right.

To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent whole is often used

wholly informally for wholly.

She found herself given over **wholly** to sensation.
