## Associations of "Encased" (30 Words)

- absolutely** With no qualification, restriction, or limitation; totally.  
*He **absolutely** adores that car.*
- altogether** With everything considered (and neglecting details).  
*It was not **altogether** her fault.*
- collectively** As a group; as a whole.  
*The vast range of resources that the American people **collectively** own.*
- completely** Totally; utterly.  
*It was **completely** different from what we expected.*
- comprise** Make up or constitute (a whole).  
*The land he conquered **comprised** several provinces.*

<b>conclusively</b>	In a way that is achieved easily or by a large margin. <i>I have shown <b>conclusively</b> that there was no such epidemic.</i>
<b>cover</b>	The protective covering on the front back and spine of a book. <i>He <b>covered</b> left field.</i>
<b>covering</b>	The act of protecting something by covering it. <i>A vinyl floor <b>covering</b>.</i>
<b>decisively</b>	In a manner that settles an issue convincingly or produces a definite result. <i>Samples from his body proved <b>decisively</b> that he was poisoned.</i>
<b>encircle</b>	Form a circle around; surround. <i>The town is <b>encircled</b> by fortified walls.</i>
<b>enclose</b>	Enclose or enfold completely with or as if with a covering. <i>The lamp was <b>enclosed</b> in a frosted glass globe.</i>
<b>encompass</b>	Include in scope; include as part of something broader; have as one's sphere or territory. <i>This group <b>encompasses</b> a wide range of people from different backgrounds.</i>
<b>entirely</b>	Without any others being included or involved. <i>The traffic seemed to consist <b>entirely</b> of black cabs.</i>
<b>envelop</b>	(of troops) surround (an enemy force). <i>Fog <b>enveloped</b> the house.</i>
<b>environ</b>	Surround; enclose. <i>The stone circle was <b>enviored</b> by an expanse of peat soil.</i>
<b>filled</b>	Of purchase orders that have been filled. <i>Theirs was a house <b>filled</b> with laughter.</i>
<b>generic</b>	Lacking imagination or individuality; predictable and unoriginal. <i>Substituting <b>generics</b> for brand name drugs.</i>
<b>include</b>	Specifically exclude someone from a group or activity. <i>The price <b>includes</b> dinner bed and breakfast.</i>
<b>perfectly</b>	In a perfect or faultless way. <i><b>Perfectly</b> clean glass bottles.</i>
<b>seal</b>	Affix a seal to. <i><b>Seal</b> the letter.</i>
<b>securely</b>	In a fixed or stable manner. <i>He is <b>securely</b> employed.</i>
<b>shroud</b>	Form a cover like a shroud. <i>They operate behind a <b>shroud</b> of secrecy.</i>

<b><u>stark</u></b>	Completely. <i>The dragoons were <b>stark</b> fellows.</i>
<b><u>surround</u></b>	The area encircling something surroundings. <i>The hotel is <b>surrounded</b> by its own gardens.</i>
<b><u>thoroughly</u></b>	Completely and absolutely good is sometimes used informally for thoroughly. <i>He searched the house <b>thoroughly</b>.</i>
<b><u>totally</u></b>	Used to emphasize a clause or statement. <i>A <b>totally</b> new situation.</i>
<b><u>undeniably</u></b>	Used to emphasize that something cannot be denied or disputed. <i>The results were <b>undeniably</b> impressive.</i>
<b><u>utterly</u></b>	Completely and without qualification; used informally as intensifiers. <i>He looked <b>utterly</b> ridiculous.</i>
<b><u>vested</u></b>	Fixed and absolute and without contingency. <i>A <b>vested</b> right.</i>
<b><u>wholly</u></b>	To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent whole is often used informally for wholly. <i>She found herself given over <b>wholly</b> to sensation.</i>
