<b>admittance</b>	The right to enter. <i>People were unable to gain <b>admittance</b> to the hall.</i>
<b>allure</b>	Dispose or incline or entice to. <i>People for whom gold holds no <b>allure</b>.</i>
<b>appeal</b>	A serious, urgent, or heartfelt request. <i>An <b>appeal</b> to raise money for starving children.</i>
<b>attract</b>	Be attractive to. <i>I was <b>attracted</b> to the idea of working for a ballet company.</i>
<b>attraction</b>	A characteristic that provides pleasure and attracts. <i>She has very romantic ideas about sexual <b>attraction</b>.</i>
<b>attractive</b>	Having the properties of a magnet; the ability to draw or pull. <i>The site is close to other prestige schemes which should make it <b>attractive</b> to developers.</i>
<b>beguile</b>	Charm or enchant (someone), often in a deceptive way. <i>To <b>beguile</b> some of the time they went to the cinema.</i>
<b><u>cachet</u></b>	A warrant formerly issued by a French king who could warrant imprisonment or death in a signed letter under his seal. <i>No other shipping company had quite the <b>cachet</b> of Cunard.</i>
<b><u>captivate</u></b>	Attract and hold the interest and attention of; charm. <i>He was <b>captivated</b> by her beauty.</i>
<b><u>charisma</u></b>	A personal attractiveness or interestingness that enables you to influence others. <i>He has tremendous <b>charisma</b> and stage presence.</i>
<b><u>charm</u></b>	A characteristic property of certain subatomic particles specifically charm quarks charm antiquarks and hadrons containing these expressed as a quantum number. <i>A gesticulating figure endeavouring to <b>charm</b> a cobra.</i>

<b><u>engage</u></b>	Engage or hire for work. <i>Some are actively <b>engaged</b> in crime.</i>
<b><u>enthrall</u></b>	Hold spellbound.
<b><u>entrance</u></b>	Attract; cause to be enamored. <i>An <b>entrance</b> examination.</i>
<b><u>fascinate</u></b>	To render motionless, as with a fixed stare or by arousing terror or awe. <i>The serpent <b>fascinates</b> its prey.</i>
<b><u>gate</u></b>	A device resembling a gate in structure or function. <i>A sluice <b>gate</b>.</i>
<b><u>gateway</u></b>	A device used to connect two different networks, especially a connection to the internet. <i>Mombasa the <b>gateway</b> to East Africa.</i>
<b><u>hypnotize</u></b>	Induce hypnosis in. <i>She gazed down <b>hypnotized</b> by the swirling tide.</i>
<b><u>inviting</u></b>	Offering the promise of an attractive or enjoyable experience. <i>An <b>inviting</b> offer.</i>
<b><u>magician</u></b>	Someone who performs magic tricks to amuse an audience. <i>He was the <b>magician</b> of the fan belt.</i>
<b><u>mesmerize</u></b>	Hypnotize (someone). <i>They were <b>mesmerized</b> by his story.</i>
<b><u>portal</u></b>	A doorway, gate, or other entrance, especially a large and imposing one. <i>The <b>portals</b> of heaven.</i>
<b><u>seduction</u></b>	A tempting or attractive thing. <i>She was planning a <b>seduction</b>.</i>
<b><u>seductive</u></b>	Tending to entice into a desired action or state. <i>A <b>seductive</b> voice.</i>
<b><u>spellbind</u></b>	Put into a trance. <i>The singer held the audience <b>spellbound</b>.</i>
<b><u>tempt</u></b>	Dispose or incline or entice to. <i>Jobs which involve entertaining may <b>tempt</b> you to drink more than you intend.</i>
<b><u>tempting</u></b>	Very pleasantly inviting. <i>A <b>tempting</b> invitation.</i>
<b><u>trance</u></b>	Put into a trance. <i>The kind of <b>trance</b> he went into whenever illness was discussed.</i>
<b><u>wile</u></b>	Lure; entice. <i>The gang had played monopoly as they <b>wiled</b> away the hours.</i>
