admittance	The right to enter. <i>People were unable to gain admittance to the hall.</i>
allure	Dispose or incline or entice to. <i>People for whom gold holds no allure.</i>
appeal	A serious, urgent, or heartfelt request. <i>An appeal to raise money for starving children.</i>
attract	Be attractive to. <i>I was attracted to the idea of working for a ballet company.</i>
attraction	A characteristic that provides pleasure and attracts. <i>She has very romantic ideas about sexual attraction.</i>
attractive	Having the properties of a magnet; the ability to draw or pull. <i>The site is close to other prestige schemes which should make it attractive to developers.</i>
beguile	Charm or enchant (someone), often in a deceptive way. <i>To beguile some of the time they went to the cinema.</i>
<u>cachet</u>	A warrant formerly issued by a French king who could warrant imprisonment or death in a signed letter under his seal. <i>No other shipping company had quite the cachet of Cunard.</i>
<u>captivate</u>	Attract and hold the interest and attention of; charm. <i>He was captivated by her beauty.</i>
<u>charisma</u>	A personal attractiveness or interestingness that enables you to influence others. <i>He has tremendous charisma and stage presence.</i>
<u>charm</u>	A characteristic property of certain subatomic particles specifically charm quarks charm antiquarks and hadrons containing these expressed as a quantum number. <i>A gesticulating figure endeavouring to charm a cobra.</i>

<u>engage</u>	Engage or hire for work. <i>Some are actively engaged in crime.</i>
<u>enthrall</u>	Hold spellbound.
<u>entrance</u>	Attract; cause to be enamored. <i>An entrance examination.</i>
<u>fascinate</u>	To render motionless, as with a fixed stare or by arousing terror or awe. <i>The serpent fascinates its prey.</i>
<u>gate</u>	A device resembling a gate in structure or function. <i>A sluice gate.</i>
gateway	A device used to connect two different networks, especially a connection to the internet. <i>Mombasa the gateway to East Africa.</i>
hypnotize	Induce hypnosis in. <i>She gazed down hypnotized by the swirling tide.</i>
<u>inviting</u>	Offering the promise of an attractive or enjoyable experience. <i>An inviting offer.</i>
<u>magician</u>	Someone who performs magic tricks to amuse an audience. <i>He was the magician of the fan belt.</i>
mesmerize	Hypnotize (someone). <i>They were mesmerized by his story.</i>
portal	A doorway, gate, or other entrance, especially a large and imposing one. <i>The portals of heaven.</i>
<u>seduction</u>	A tempting or attractive thing. <i>She was planning a seduction.</i>
<u>seductive</u>	Tending to entice into a desired action or state. <i>A seductive voice.</i>
spellbind	Put into a trance. <i>The singer held the audience spellbound.</i>
<u>tempt</u>	Dispose or incline or entice to. <i>Jobs which involve entertaining may tempt you to drink more than you intend.</i>
<u>tempting</u>	Very pleasantly inviting. <i>A tempting invitation.</i>
<u>trance</u>	Put into a trance. <i>The kind of trance he went into whenever illness was discussed.</i>
wile	Lure; entice. <i>The gang had played monopoly as they wiled away the hours.</i>
