- alluring** Powerfully and mysteriously attractive or fascinating; seductive.
*The town offers **alluring** shops and restaurants.*
- appealing** (of characters in literature or drama) evoking empathic or sympathetic feelings.
*An **appealing** look.*
- attractive** (of a person) appealing to look at; sexually alluring.
*The job is **attractive** because of the pay.*
- beguiling** Charming or enchanting, often in a deceptive way.
*The voice was low and **beguiling**.*
- bewitching** Capturing interest as if by a spell.
***Bewitching** smile.*
- captivating** Capturing interest as if by a spell.
*Roosevelt was a **captivating** speaker.*

<u>charming</u>	(of a person or their manner) very polite, friendly, and likeable. <i>He was a charming affectionate colleague.</i>
<u>dazzling</u>	Amazingly impressive; suggestive of the flashing of lightning. <i>A dazzling smile.</i>
<u>delightful</u>	Greatly pleasing or entertaining. <i>The comedy was delightful.</i>
<u>disarming</u>	(of manner or behaviour) having the effect of allaying suspicion or hostility, especially through charm. <i>He gave her a disarming smile.</i>
dreamy	Dreamy in mood or nature. <i>I bet he was really dreamy.</i>
engaging	Attracting or delighting. <i>An engaging frankness.</i>
enthraling	Capturing interest as if by a spell. <i>An enthraling best seller.</i>
<u>entrancing</u>	Capable of attracting and holding interest; charming. <i>An entrancing smile.</i>
<u>fascinating</u>	Capable of arousing and holding the attention. <i>A fascinating woman.</i>
fetching	Very attractive; capturing interest. <i>A fetching new hairstyle.</i>
<u>irresistible</u>	Too attractive and tempting to be resisted. <i>She felt an irresistible urge to object.</i>
<u>ravishing</u>	Stunningly beautiful. <i>She looked ravishing.</i>
<u>seductive</u>	Tempting and attractive; enticing. <i>A seductive voice.</i>
spellbinding	Attracting and holding interest as if by a spell. <i>A place of spellbinding beauty.</i>
<u>tantalizing</u>	Arousing desire or expectation for something unattainable or mockingly out of reach. <i>A tantalizing aroma.</i>
winning	Gaining, resulting in, or relating to victory in a contest or competition. <i>A winning smile.</i>

appealing	(of characters in literature or drama) evoking empathic or sympathetic feelings. <i>He added an appealing and memorable figure to popular American mythology.</i>
attractive	Having qualities or features which arouse interest. <i>The attractive force between the magnets and the metal plate.</i>
beautifully	In a way that pleases the senses or mind aesthetically. <i>Her face was beautifully made up.</i>
charming	Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers- Shakespeare. <i>A charming country cottage.</i>
cute	Clever or cunning, especially in a self-seeking or superficial way. <i>A cute kid with pigtails.</i>
delightful	Causing delight; charming. <i>A delightful secluded garden.</i>
engrossing	Absorbing all one's attention or interest. <i>The most engrossing parts of the book.</i>
enthraling	Capturing interest as if by a spell. <i>An enthraling best seller.</i>
enticing	Highly attractive and able to arouse hope or desire. <i>Difficult to say no to an enticing advertisement.</i>
entrancing	Capable of attracting and holding interest; charming. <i>Antique papers of entrancing design.</i>
exciting	Creating or arousing excitement. <i>An exciting novel.</i>
fascinated	Having your attention fixated as though by a spell. <i>A crowd of fascinated onlookers.</i>
fascinating	Extremely interesting. <i>A fascinating book.</i>
fascination	The power to fascinate someone; the quality of being fascinating. <i>He held the children spellbound with magic tricks and other fascinations.</i>
glamorize	Interpret romantically. <i>This new wallpaper really glamorizes the living room.</i>

interesting	Arousing curiosity or interest; holding or catching the attention. <i>An interesting debate.</i>
intriguing	Disturbingly provocative. <i>The food is an intriguing combination of German and French.</i>
inviting	Offering the promise of an attractive or enjoyable experience. <i>An inviting offer.</i>
irresistible	Too powerful or convincing to be resisted. <i>What happens when an irresistible force meets an immovable object.</i>
irresistibly	In a way that is too attractive and tempting to be resisted. <i>I am irresistibly reminded of the advice of a friend of mine.</i>
personable	(of a person) having a pleasant appearance and manner. <i>She is quite a personable young woman.</i>
riveting	Completely engrossing; compelling. <i>The book is a riveting account of the legendary freedom fighter.</i>
salient	Pointing outward at an angle of less than 180 degrees. <i>Salient traits.</i>
seductive	Tending to entice into a desired action or state. <i>A seductive voice.</i>
stunning	Causing or capable of causing bewilderment or shock or insensibility. <i>A stunning performance.</i>
tempting	Appealing to or attracting someone, even if wrong or unwise. <i>It is often tempting to bring about change rapidly.</i>
winsome	Attractive or appealing in a fresh, innocent way. <i>A winsome smile.</i>
