## Synonyms of "Enchanting" as an adjective (22 Words)

<b>alluring</b>	Powerfully and mysteriously attractive or fascinating; seductive. <i>The town offers <b>alluring</b> shops and restaurants.</i>
<b>appealing</b>	(of characters in literature or drama) evoking empathic or sympathetic feelings. <i>An <b>appealing</b> look.</i>
<b>attractive</b>	(of a person) appealing to look at; sexually alluring. <i>The job is <b>attractive</b> because of the pay.</i>
<b>beguiling</b>	Charming or enchanting, often in a deceptive way. <i>The voice was low and <b>beguiling</b>.</i>
<b>bewitching</b>	Capturing interest as if by a spell. <i><b>Bewitching</b> smile.</i>
<b>captivating</b>	Capturing interest as if by a spell. <i>Roosevelt was a <b>captivating</b> speaker.</i>

<b><u>charming</u></b>	(of a person or their manner) very polite, friendly, and likeable. <i>He was a <b>charming</b> affectionate colleague.</i>
<b><u>dazzling</u></b>	Amazingly impressive; suggestive of the flashing of lightning. <i>A <b>dazzling</b> smile.</i>
<b><u>delightful</u></b>	Greatly pleasing or entertaining. <i>The comedy was <b>delightful</b>.</i>
<b><u>disarming</u></b>	(of manner or behaviour) having the effect of allaying suspicion or hostility, especially through charm. <i>He gave her a <b>disarming</b> smile.</i>
<b>dreamy</b>	Dreamy in mood or nature. <i>I bet he was really <b>dreamy</b>.</i>
<b>engaging</b>	Attracting or delighting. <i>An <b>engaging</b> frankness.</i>
<b>enthraling</b>	Capturing interest as if by a spell. <i>An <b>enthraling</b> best seller.</i>
<b><u>entrancing</u></b>	Capable of attracting and holding interest; charming. <i>An <b>entrancing</b> smile.</i>
<b><u>fascinating</u></b>	Capable of arousing and holding the attention. <i>A <b>fascinating</b> woman.</i>
<b>fetching</b>	Very attractive; capturing interest. <i>A <b>fetching</b> new hairstyle.</i>
<b><u>irresistible</u></b>	Too attractive and tempting to be resisted. <i>She felt an <b>irresistible</b> urge to object.</i>
<b><u>ravishing</u></b>	Stunningly beautiful. <i>She looked <b>ravishing</b>.</i>
<b><u>seductive</u></b>	Tempting and attractive; enticing. <i>A <b>seductive</b> voice.</i>
<b>spellbinding</b>	Attracting and holding interest as if by a spell. <i>A place of <b>spellbinding</b> beauty.</i>
<b><u>tantalizing</u></b>	Arousing desire or expectation for something unattainable or mockingly out of reach. <i>A <b>tantalizing</b> aroma.</i>
<b>winning</b>	Gaining, resulting in, or relating to victory in a contest or competition. <i>A <b>winning</b> smile.</i>

<b>adorable</b>	Inspiring great affection or delight. <i>I have four <b>adorable</b> Siamese cats.</i>
<b>aesthetically</b>	With regard to beauty. <i>This building is <b>aesthetically</b> very pleasing.</i>
<b>appealing</b>	(of characters in literature or drama) evoking empathic or sympathetic feelings. <i>He added an <b>appealing</b> and memorable figure to popular American mythology.</i>
<b>attractive</b>	Having qualities or features which arouse interest. <i>The <b>attractive</b> force between the magnets and the metal plate.</i>
<b>beautifully</b>	In a way that pleases the senses or mind aesthetically. <i>Her face was <b>beautifully</b> made up.</i>
<b>charming</b>	Possessing or using or characteristic of or appropriate to supernatural powers- Shakespeare. <i>A <b>charming</b> country cottage.</i>
<b>cute</b>	Clever or cunning, especially in a self-seeking or superficial way. <i>A <b>cute</b> kid with pigtails.</i>
<b>delightful</b>	Causing delight; charming. <i>A <b>delightful</b> secluded garden.</i>
<b>engrossing</b>	Absorbing all one's attention or interest. <i>The most <b>engrossing</b> parts of the book.</i>
<b>enthralling</b>	Capturing interest as if by a spell. <i>An <b>enthralling</b> best seller.</i>
<b>enticing</b>	Highly attractive and able to arouse hope or desire. <i>Difficult to say no to an <b>enticing</b> advertisement.</i>
<b>entrancing</b>	Capable of attracting and holding interest; charming. <i>Antique papers of <b>entrancing</b> design.</i>
<b>exciting</b>	Creating or arousing excitement. <i>An <b>exciting</b> novel.</i>
<b>fascinated</b>	Having your attention fixated as though by a spell. <i>A crowd of <b>fascinated</b> onlookers.</i>
<b>fascinating</b>	Extremely interesting. <i>A <b>fascinating</b> book.</i>
<b>fascination</b>	The power to fascinate someone; the quality of being fascinating. <i>He held the children spellbound with magic tricks and other <b>fascinations</b>.</i>
<b>glamorize</b>	Interpret romantically. <i>This new wallpaper really <b>glamorizes</b> the living room.</i>

<b>interesting</b>	Arousing curiosity or interest; holding or catching the attention. <i>An <b>interesting</b> debate.</i>
<b>intriguing</b>	Disturbingly provocative. <i>The food is an <b>intriguing</b> combination of German and French.</i>
<u><b>inviting</b></u>	Offering the promise of an attractive or enjoyable experience. <i>An <b>inviting</b> offer.</i>
<u><b>irresistible</b></u>	Too powerful or convincing to be resisted. <i>What happens when an <b>irresistible</b> force meets an immovable object.</i>
<b>irresistibly</b>	In a way that is too attractive and tempting to be resisted. <i>I am <b>irresistibly</b> reminded of the advice of a friend of mine.</i>
<u><b>personable</b></u>	(of a person) having a pleasant appearance and manner. <i>She is quite a <b>personable</b> young woman.</i>
<u><b>riveting</b></u>	Completely engrossing; compelling. <i>The book is a <b>riveting</b> account of the legendary freedom fighter.</i>
<u><b>salient</b></u>	Pointing outward at an angle of less than 180 degrees. <i><b>Salient</b> traits.</i>
<u><b>seductive</b></u>	Tending to entice into a desired action or state. <i>A <b>seductive</b> voice.</i>
<b>stunning</b>	Causing or capable of causing bewilderment or shock or insensibility. <i>A <b>stunning</b> performance.</i>
<u><b>tempting</b></u>	Appealing to or attracting someone, even if wrong or unwise. <i>It is often <b>tempting</b> to bring about change rapidly.</i>
<b>winsome</b>	Attractive or appealing in a fresh, innocent way. <i>A <b>winsome</b> smile.</i>
