## Enclave as a Noun

### Definitions of "Enclave" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “enclave” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *An enclosed territory that is culturally distinct from the foreign territory that surrounds it.*
- *A portion of territory surrounded by a larger territory whose inhabitants are culturally or ethnically distinct.*
- *A place or group that is different in character from those surrounding it.*

### Synonyms of "Enclave" as a noun (3 Words)

<b>area</b>	A particular geographical region of indefinite boundary (usually serving some special purpose or distinguished by its people or culture or geography. <i>Rural <b>areas</b> of Britain.</i>
<b>area of land</b>	A part of an animal that has a special function or is supplied by a given artery or nerve.
<a href="#">region</a>	The approximate amount of something usually used prepositionally as in in the region of. <i>Penguins inhabit the polar <b>regions</b>.</i>

- *The engineering department is traditionally a male enclave.*

<b>identity</b>	(of an object) serving to establish who the holder, owner, or wearer is by bearing their name and often other details such as a signature or photograph. <i>You can lose your <b>identity</b> when you join the army.</i>
<b>independence</b>	Freedom from control or influence of another or others. <i>I ve always valued my <b>independence</b>.</i>
<b>inland</b>	Situated in the interior of a country rather than on the coast. <i>A network of waterways that allowed <b>inland</b> trade.</i>
<b>inner</b>	Innermost or essential. <i>Join a choir and give voice to that <b>inner</b> diva who has been hidden away too long.</i>
<b>innermost</b>	Situated or occurring farthest within. <i><b>Innermost</b> beliefs and convictions.</i>

<b>inside</b>	On the inside. <i>An <b>inside</b> wall.</i>
<b>interior</b>	The United States federal department charged with conservation and the development of natural resources; created in 1849. <i>The <b>interior</b> minister.</i>
<u><b>internal</b></u>	Innermost or essential. <i>The tube had an <b>internal</b> diameter of 1 1 mm.</i>
<b>inward</b>	Directed or moving inward or toward a center. <i>A concern with <b>inward</b> reflections.</i>
<b>landlocked</b>	(of a lake or harbour) enclosed by land and having no navigable route to the sea. <i>Maine s <b>landlocked</b> seabago salmon.</i>
<b>legacy</b>	Denoting or relating to software or hardware that has been superseded but is difficult to replace because of its wide use. <i>My grandmother died and unexpectedly left me a small <b>legacy</b>.</i>
<b>militarism</b>	A political orientation of a people or a government to maintain a strong military force and to be prepared to use it aggressively to defend or promote national interests. <i>The need for liberal democratic reforms to avoid a revival of <b>militarism</b>.</i>
<b>mountainous</b>	Like a mountain in size and impressiveness. <i>A <b>mountainous</b> dark man.</i>
<b>municipality</b>	The governing body of a municipality. <i>Voters in each <b>municipality</b> choose between four candidates.</i>
<u><b>national</b></u>	Owned or maintained for the public by the national government. <i>A <b>national</b> newspaper.</i>
<b>nationalism</b>	Advocacy of or support for the political independence of a particular nation or people. <i>Scottish <b>nationalism</b>.</i>
<u><b>native</b></u>	Used in names of animals or plants resembling others familiar elsewhere e g native bee. <i>The marigold is a <b>native</b> of southern Europe.</i>
<u><b>patriotism</b></u>	The quality of being patriotic; devotion to and vigorous support for one's country. <i>They rode the same wave of popular <b>patriotism</b>.</i>
<b>personal</b>	An advertisement or message in the personal column of a newspaper. <i>He has his <b>personal</b> bank account and she has hers.</i>
<u><b>private</b></u>	Concerning things deeply private and personal. <i><b>Private</b> family matters.</i>
