Encode as a Verb

Definitions of "Encode" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “encode” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Convert (information or an instruction) into a particular form.*
- *Convert into a coded form.*
- *(of a gene) be responsible for producing (a substance or behaviour).*
- *Convert information into code.*



Synonyms of "Encode" as a verb (2 Words)

coded Convert ordinary language into code.

encoded Convert information into code.



Usage Examples of "Encode" as a verb

- *Using this technique makes it possible to encode and transmit recorded video information.*
- *This is the gene that encodes the yeast mating type protein.*

- *Encode pictures digitally.*
- *Such distortions can damage the genes encoding for the proteins that suppress tumor growth.*
- *The amount of time required to encode a wav file to mp3 format.*



Associations of "Encode" (30 Words)

authenticate	Prove or show (something) to be true, genuine, or valid. <i>It only accepts commands from users who have authenticated as clients.</i>
<u>binary</u>	The binary system of notation. <i>A binary star is a system in which two stars revolve around each other.</i>
breaking	The act of breaking something.
cipher	A secret method of writing. <i>He wrote cryptic notes in a cipher.</i>

code	Be the genetic code for an amino acid or protein. <i>One pair of homologous chromosomes codes for eye colour.</i>
codify	Arrange according to a plan or system. <i>This would codify existing intergovernmental cooperation on drugs.</i>
coding	Functioning as the genetic code or determiner for an amino acid, protein, or characteristic. <i>PAYE codings.</i>
computing	The use or operation of computers. <i>Developments in mathematics and computing.</i>
cryptogram	A symbol or figure with secret or occult significance.
cryptography	The art of writing or solving codes.
decipher	Convert (a text written in code, or a coded signal) into normal language. <i>Visual signals help us decipher what is being communicated.</i>
decode	A translation of a coded message. <i>He put down the phone and decoded the message.</i>
encrypt	Convert ordinary language into code. <i>The password cannot be broken as it is encrypted in the hardware.</i>
encryption	The activity of converting data or information into code. <i>I use encryption to protect sensitive information transmitted online.</i>
entomb	Bury or trap within something. <i>Many people died most entombed in collapsed buildings.</i>
factorize	(with reference to a number) resolve or be resolvable into factors. <i>All matrices can be factorized.</i>
firewall	Protect a network or system from unauthorized access with a firewall. <i>A firewalled network.</i>
hash	Make meat or other food into a hash. <i>They met during the day to hash out the campaign's reaction to the controversy.</i>
indecipherable	Not able to be read or understood. <i>An indecipherable message.</i>
lock	Go through a lock on a canal. <i>The door will automatically lock behind you.</i>
mausoleum	A stately or impressive building housing a tomb or group of tombs. <i>The cathedral was built in 1517 as a royal mausoleum.</i>
mnemonic	Of or relating to or involved the practice of aiding the memory. <i>Mnemonic device.</i>

password	A secret word or phrase known only to a restricted group. <i>Each user has a password in order to log on to the network.</i>
remember	Recapture the past; indulge in memories. <i>Remember me to Charlie.</i>
reminiscence	The process of remembering (especially the process of recovering information by mental effort). <i>His story made me smile in reminiscence.</i>
secret	Given in confidence or in secret. <i>He tried to keep his drinking a secret.</i>
<u>underground</u>	An underground railway especially the one in London. <i>Underground resistance.</i>
<u>underneath</u>	Partly or wholly concealed by a garment. <i>Paint was peeling off in flakes to reveal greyish plaster underneath.</i>
<u>unlock</u>	Become unlocked. <i>He unlocked the door to his room.</i>
<u>zero</u>	Adjust as by firing under test conditions the zero of a gun. <i>The rifle had been zeroed at an elevation of 200.</i>
