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## Associations of "End up" (30 Words)

<a href="#">apex</a>	The growing point of a shoot. <i>He understands when to <b>apex</b> a corner.</i>
<b>ascending</b>	Moving or going or growing upward. <i>Incomes ranked in <b>ascending</b> order of size.</i>
<b>climactic</b>	Consisting of or causing a climax. <i>The film s <b>climactic</b> scenes.</i>
<a href="#">climb</a>	A mountain hill or slope that is climbed. <i>There were roses <b>climbing</b> up the walls.</i>
<a href="#">closing</a>	The act of closing something. <i>The <b>closing</b> stages of the election.</i>
<b>completion</b>	(American football) a successful forward pass in football. <i>The <b>completion</b> date is early next year.</i>
<a href="#">culminate</a>	(of a celestial body) reach or be at the meridian. <i>The meeting <b>culminated</b> in a tearful embrace.</i>
<b>culmination</b>	A concluding action. <i>The deal marked the <b>culmination</b> of years of negotiation.</i>
<b>elevator</b>	A shoe with a raised insole designed to make the wearer appear taller. <i>Something in his gait made me sure he was wearing <b>elevator</b> shoes.</i>
<b>ending</b>	The end of a word a suffix or inflectional ending or final morpheme. <i>A nerve <b>ending</b>.</i>
<b>epilogue</b>	A final or concluding act or event. <i>A disastrous <b>epilogue</b> to the rest of his career.</i>
<b>eventually</b>	In the end, especially after a long delay, dispute, or series of problems. <i><b>Eventually</b> after midnight I arrived at the hotel.</i>
<a href="#">final</a>	The final approach of an aircraft to the runway it will be landing on. <i>The plane piloted by Richards was on <b>finals</b>.</i>

<b>finale</b>	The last part of a piece of music, an entertainment, or a public event, especially when particularly dramatic or exciting. <i>A fireworks <b>finale</b>.</i>
<b>finish</b>	Provide with a finish. <i>The fastest runner <b>finished</b> the race in just over 2 hours others <b>finished</b> in over 4 hours.</i>
<b>last</b>	Especially in enumerating points lastly. <i>The <b>last</b> person we would have suspected.</i>
<b>lift</b>	A wave that lifts the surface of the water or ground. <i>He <b>lifted</b> his eyes for an instant.</i>
<b>lofty</b>	Of imposing height; especially standing out above others. <i>A noble and <b>lofty</b> concept.</i>
<b>peak</b>	The highest level or degree attainable; the highest stage of development. <i>The view from the <b>peak</b> was magnificent.</i>
<b>peroration</b>	(rhetoric) the concluding section of an oration. <i>He again invoked the theme in an emotional <b>peroration</b>.</i>
<b>proliferation</b>	Rapid reproduction of a cell, part, or organism. <i>A continuing threat of nuclear <b>proliferation</b>.</i>
<b>rise</b>	The property possessed by a slope or surface that rises. <i>They asked for a 10 <b>rise</b> in rates.</i>
<b>risen</b>	(of e.g. celestial bodies) above the horizon. <i>The <b>risen</b> sun.</i>
<b>rising</b>	Sloping upward. <i>The <b>rising</b> fives on the verge of school.</i>
<b>superlative</b>	A superlative adjective or adverb. <i>Chilli has become the <b>superlative</b> among spices.</i>
<b>top</b>	Provide with a top or finish the top of a structure. <i>Losses are expected to <b>top</b> 100 m this year.</i>
<b>upward</b>	Moving, pointing, or leading to a higher place, point, or level. <i>She peered <b>upward</b> at the sky.</i>
<b>windup</b>	A concluding action. <i><b>Windup</b> toys.</i>
<b>zenith</b>	The point in the sky or celestial sphere directly above an observer. <i>In 1977 punk was at its <b>zenith</b>.</i>
