apex	The growing point of a shoot. <i>He understands when to apex a corner.</i>
ascending	Moving or going or growing upward. <i>Incomes ranked in ascending order of size.</i>
climactic	Consisting of or causing a climax. <i>The film s climactic scenes.</i>
climb	A mountain hill or slope that is climbed. <i>There were roses climbing up the walls.</i>
closing	The act of closing something. <i>The closing stages of the election.</i>
completion	(American football) a successful forward pass in football. <i>The completion date is early next year.</i>
culminate	(of a celestial body) reach or be at the meridian. <i>The meeting culminated in a tearful embrace.</i>
culmination	A concluding action. <i>The deal marked the culmination of years of negotiation.</i>
elevator	A shoe with a raised insole designed to make the wearer appear taller. <i>Something in his gait made me sure he was wearing elevator shoes.</i>
ending	The end of a word a suffix or inflectional ending or final morpheme. <i>A nerve ending.</i>
epilogue	A final or concluding act or event. <i>A disastrous epilogue to the rest of his career.</i>
eventually	In the end, especially after a long delay, dispute, or series of problems. <i>Eventually after midnight I arrived at the hotel.</i>
final	The final approach of an aircraft to the runway it will be landing on. <i>The plane piloted by Richards was on finals.</i>

finale	The last part of a piece of music, an entertainment, or a public event, especially when particularly dramatic or exciting. <i>A fireworks finale.</i>
finish	Provide with a finish. <i>The fastest runner finished the race in just over 2 hours others finished in over 4 hours.</i>
last	Especially in enumerating points lastly. <i>The last person we would have suspected.</i>
lift	A wave that lifts the surface of the water or ground. <i>He lifted his eyes for an instant.</i>
lofty	Of imposing height; especially standing out above others. <i>A noble and lofty concept.</i>
peak	The highest level or degree attainable; the highest stage of development. <i>The view from the peak was magnificent.</i>
peroration	(rhetoric) the concluding section of an oration. <i>He again invoked the theme in an emotional peroration.</i>
proliferation	Rapid reproduction of a cell, part, or organism. <i>A continuing threat of nuclear proliferation.</i>
rise	The property possessed by a slope or surface that rises. <i>They asked for a 10 rise in rates.</i>
risen	(of e.g. celestial bodies) above the horizon. <i>The risen sun.</i>
rising	Sloping upward. <i>The rising fives on the verge of school.</i>
superlative	A superlative adjective or adverb. <i>Chilli has become the superlative among spices.</i>
top	Provide with a top or finish the top of a structure. <i>Losses are expected to top 100 m this year.</i>
upward	Moving, pointing, or leading to a higher place, point, or level. <i>She peered upward at the sky.</i>
windup	A concluding action. <i>Windup toys.</i>
zenith	The point in the sky or celestial sphere directly above an observer. <i>In 1977 punk was at its zenith.</i>
