apex	The highest point (of something). <i>The central bank is at the apex of the financial system.</i>
ascending	Sloping or leading upwards. <i>The ascending staircase.</i>
climactic	Consisting of or causing a climax. <i>The film s climactic scenes.</i>
climb	A mountain hill or slope that is climbed. <i>We began to climb the hill.</i>
closing	The act of closing something. <i>The ship s rapid rate of closing gave them little time to avoid a collision.</i>
completion	The state of being finished. <i>The completion date is early next year.</i>
culminate	Reach the highest or most decisive point. <i>The star culminates at midnight on about the 30th April.</i>
culmination	The decisive moment in a novel or play. <i>The deal marked the culmination of years of negotiation.</i>
elevator	A muscle whose contraction raises a part of the body. <i>Something in his gait made me sure he was wearing elevator shoes.</i>
ending	The act of ending something. <i>A nerve ending.</i>
epilogue	A short speech (often in verse) addressed directly to the audience by an actor at the end of a play. <i>The epilogue told what eventually happened to the main characters.</i>
eventually	In the end, especially after a long delay, dispute, or series of problems. <i>Eventually after midnight I arrived at the hotel.</i>
final	The final approach of an aircraft to the runway it will be landing on. <i>She was doing her history finals.</i>

finale	The last part of a piece of music, an entertainment, or a public event, especially when particularly dramatic or exciting. <i>The finale of Beethoven's Ninth Symphony.</i>
finish	The act of finishing. <i>It was a fight to the finish.</i>
last	Especially in enumerating points lastly. <i>The last days of the dinosaurs.</i>
lift	A wave that lifts the surface of the water or ground. <i>The lift door opened.</i>
lofty	Of high moral or intellectual value; elevated in nature or style- Oliver Franks. <i>Lofty mountains.</i>
peak	The highest level or degree attainable; the highest stage of development. <i>A slight increase in velocity provides a second peak on the general velocity curve.</i>
peroration	A flowery and highly rhetorical oration. <i>He again invoked the theme in an emotional peroration.</i>
proliferation	A large number of something. <i>A continuing threat of nuclear proliferation.</i>
rise	The property possessed by a slope or surface that rises. <i>They cheered the rise of the hot air balloon.</i>
risen	Above the horizon. <i>The risen sun.</i>
rising	Going up, increasing, or sloping upward. <i>The rising fives on the verge of school.</i>
superlative	The superlative form of an adjective or adverb. <i>The critics ran out of superlatives to describe him.</i>
top	Reach the top of a hill or other elevation. <i>Put your books on top of the desk.</i>
upward	To a later time. <i>Prices soared upwards.</i>
windup	Operated by a mechanism. <i>Windup toys.</i>
zenith	The highest point reached by a given celestial object. <i>In 1977 punk was at its zenith.</i>
