<b>boundless</b>	Seemingly boundless in amount number degree or especially extent. <i>Children with <b>boundless</b> energy.</i>

<b>endless</b>	Infinitely great in number. <i><b>Endless</b> waves.</i>
<b><u>enduring</u></b>	Lasting a long time. <i>An <b>enduring</b> disposition.</i>
<b><u>eternal</u></b>	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>The secret of <b>eternal</b> youth.</i>
<b><u>ever</u></b>	At all times all the time and on every occasion. <i><b>Ever</b> busy.</i>

<b>every</b>	(used of count nouns) each and all of the members of a group considered singly and without exception. <i>Had <b>every</b> hope of success.</i>
<b>forever</b>	Used in slogans of support after the name of something or someone. <i>It took <b>forever</b> to get a passport.</i>
<b>grinding</b>	A harsh and strident sound as of the grinding of gears. <i>The <b>grinding</b> roar of the lorries.</i>
<b>incessant</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Night and day we live with the <b>incessant</b> noise of the city.</i>
<b>incessantly</b>	Without interruption. <i>She talked about him <b>incessantly</b>.</i>
<b>increasingly</b>	Advancing in amount or intensity. <i>An <b>increasingly</b> difficult situation.</i>
<b>infinitely</b>	To an infinite extent or amount; without limit. <i>Doing something is <b>infinitely</b> preferable to doing nothing.</i>
<b>interminable</b>	Tiresomely long; seemingly without end. <i>An <b>interminable</b> sermon.</i>
<b>invariably</b>	Without variation or change, in every case. <i>Ranch meals are <b>invariably</b> big and hearty.</i>
<b>limitless</b>	Without limits in extent or size or quantity. <i>Our resources are not <b>limitless</b>.</i>
<b>long</b>	A long sound such as a long signal in Morse code or a long vowel or syllable. <i>In <b>long</b> supply.</i>
<b>perpetual</b>	Never ending or changing. <i>A <b>perpetual</b> bond.</i>
<b>perpetually</b>	In a way that never ends or changes; constantly. <i>She seems <b>perpetually</b> to have a mournful look on her face.</i>
<b>persistent</b>	Retained; not shed. <i>One of the government's most <b>persistent</b> critics.</i>
<b>preferable</b>	More desirable or suitable. <i>Lower interest rates were <b>preferable</b> to higher ones.</i>
<b>progressively</b>	Advancing in amount or intensity. <i>Symptoms become <b>progressively</b> worse over a period of years.</i>
<b>steady</b>	In a steady manner. <i>His <b>steady</b> chucked him two weeks ago.</i>
<b>unceasingly</b>	With unflagging resolve.
