Associations of "Ends up" (30 Words)

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| apex | The point in turning a corner when the vehicle is closest to the edge of the track. <i>The apex of his career was in 1966 when he hoisted aloft the World Cup for England.</i> |
| ascending | Increasing in size or importance. <i>Blood pressure in the ascending aorta.</i> |
| climactic | Consisting of or causing a climax. <i>The film s climactic scenes.</i> |
| climb | An ascent especially of a mountain or hill by climbing. <i>Sales were climbing after prices were lowered.</i> |
| closing | The act of closing something. <i>The closing stages of the election campaign.</i> |
| completion | A successful forward pass in football. <i>Work on the new golf course is nearing completion.</i> |
| culminate | Reach the highest or most decisive point. <i>The star culminates at midnight on about the 30th April.</i> |
| culmination | A heavenly body's highest celestial point above an observer's horizon. <i>Their achievements stand as a culmination of centuries of development.</i> |
| elevator | A platform or compartment housed in a shaft for raising and lowering people or things to different levels; a lift. <i>In the harbour a giant elevator stores prairie grain.</i> |
| ending | The end of a word a suffix or inflectional ending or final morpheme. <i>The ending of the Cold War.</i> |
| epilogue | A short passage added at the end of a literary work. <i>The meaning of the book s title is revealed in the epilogue.</i> |
| eventually | In the end, especially after a long delay, dispute, or series of problems. <i>Eventually after midnight I arrived at the hotel.</i> |

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| final | The final approach of an aircraft to the runway it will be landing on. <i>The World Cup finals.</i> |
| finale | The concluding part of any performance. <i>A fireworks finale.</i> |
| finish | Finish eating all the food on one's plate or on the table. <i>Excitement grew as the finish neared.</i> |
| last | The last person or thing the one occurring mentioned or acting after all others. <i>A struggle to the last.</i> |
| lift | An act of lifting. <i>The Puma tactical transport helicopter has a total lift of up to 5 500 lb.</i> |
| lofty | Of a noble or elevated nature. <i>An extraordinary mixture of harsh reality and lofty ideals.</i> |
| peak | A stiff brim at the front of a cap. <i>He climbed his last Swiss peak at the age of 80.</i> |
| peroration | A flowery and highly rhetorical oration. <i>He again invoked the theme in an emotional peroration.</i> |
| proliferation | A rapid increase in number (especially a rapid increase in the number of deadly weapons). <i>A continuing threat of nuclear proliferation.</i> |
| rise | Rise to one's feet. <i>He felt the hairs rise on the back of his neck.</i> |
| risen | Above the horizon. <i>The risen sun.</i> |
| rising | An armed protest against authority; a revolt. <i>The rising fives on the verge of school.</i> |
| superlative | The superlative form of an adjective or adverb. <i>So many highest superlatives achieved by man.</i> |
| top | Provide with a top or finish the top of a structure. <i>They topped off their dinner with a cognac.</i> |
| upward | Towards a higher place, point, or level. <i>An upward stroke of the pen.</i> |
| windup | Operated by a mechanism. <i>Windup toys.</i> |
| zenith | The point above the observer that is directly opposite the nadir on the imaginary sphere against which celestial bodies appear to be projected. <i>In 1977 punk was at its zenith.</i> |
