
Endurance as a Noun

- The ability to endure an unpleasant or difficult process or situation without giving way.

<u>bearing</u>	Characteristic way of bearing one s body. The Point is on a bearing of 015.
continuance	The state of remaining in existence or operation. Scheduling trial dates and refusing to grant continuance s are part of a judge s prerogative.
<u>continuation</u>	The state of remaining in a particular position or condition. <i>The government s continuation</i> in office.
continuity	A state of stability and the absence of disruption. <i>They have provided the country with a measure of</i> continuity .



<u>determination</u>	The quality of being determined to do or achieve something; firmness of purpose. Determination of molecular structures.
doggedness	Persistent determination.
durability	The ability to withstand wear, pressure, or damage. <i>The reliability and durability of plastics.</i>
forbearance	Good-natured tolerance of delay or incompetence. <i>His unfailing courtesy and forbearance under great provocation.</i>
fortitude	Strength of mind that enables one to endure adversity with courage. She endured her illness with great fortitude .
indefatigability	Tireless determination.
<u>longevity</u>	The property of being long-lived. The greater longevity of women compared with men.
patience	The capacity to accept or tolerate delay, problems, or suffering without becoming annoyed or anxious. <i>I have run out of patience with her.</i>
permanence	The state or quality of lasting or remaining unchanged indefinitely. The clarity and permanence of the dyes.
perseverance	The act of persisting or persevering; continuing or repeating behavior. <i>Medicine is a field which requires dedication and perseverance.</i>
persistence	The fact of continuing in an opinion or course of action in spite of difficulty or opposition. <i>Cardiff s persistence</i> was rewarded with a try.
pertinacity	Persistent determination.
resignation	An act of resigning from a job or office. <i>He submitted his resignation as of next month.</i>
resoluteness	The trait of being resolute. His resoluteness carried him through the battle.
resolution	Computer science the number of pixels per square inch on a computer generated display the greater the resolution the better the picture. <i>A high resolution monitor.</i>
<u>stamina</u>	The ability to sustain prolonged physical or mental effort. Their secret is stamina rather than speed.
staying power	Brace consisting of a heavy rope or wire cable used as a support for a mast or spar.
<u>stoicism</u>	An indifference to pleasure or pain.



sufferance	Patient endurance especially of pain or distress. <i>An estate at sufferance</i> .
<u>survival</u>	The state or fact of continuing to live or exist, typically in spite of an accident, ordeal, or difficult circumstances. The animal s chances of survival were pretty low.
<u>tenacity</u>	The quality or fact of being very determined; determination. <i>The sheer tenacity of the limpet.</i>
tirelessness	Tireless determination.
tolerance	A permissible difference; allowing some freedom to move within limits. <i>The tolerance of corruption.</i>
toleration	The practice of tolerating something, in particular differences of opinion or behaviour. The king demanded greater religious toleration .

forbear	Resist doing something. He modestly forbear s to include his own work.
forbearance	Patient self-control; restraint and tolerance. <i>His unfailing courtesy and forbearance under great provocation.</i>
fortitude	Strength of mind that enables one to endure adversity with courage. <i>She endured her illness with great fortitude</i> .



hardheaded	Guided by practical experience and observation rather than theory. A hardheaded appraisal of our position.
hidebound	Unwilling or unable to change because of tradition or convention. They are working to change hidebound corporate cultures.
indomitable	Impossible to subdue. A woman of indomitable spirit.
intransigent	An intransigent person. Her father had tried persuasion but she was intransigent .
obdurate	Showing unfeeling resistance to tender feelings. I argued this point with him but he was obdurate .
obstinacy	The trait of being difficult to handle or overcome. <i>His reputation for obstinacy</i> .
obstinate	Tenaciously unwilling or marked by tenacious unwillingness to yield. <i>Her</i> obstinate determination to pursue a career in radio.
patience	Good-natured tolerance of delay or incompetence. I have run out of patience with her.
perseverance	Persistent determination. <i>Medicine is a field which requires dedication and perseverance</i> .
persistence	The fact of continuing in an opinion or course of action in spite of difficulty or opposition. <i>Cardiff s persistence</i> was rewarded with a try.
pertinacious	Stubbornly unyielding- T.S.Eliot. The most vocal and pertinacious of all the critics.
pertinacity	Persistent determination.
<u>reliance</u>	Dependence on or trust in someone or something. <i>The farmer s reliance on pesticides.</i>
<u>resolute</u>	Admirably purposeful, determined, and unwavering. Faced with a resolute opposition.
resourcefulness	The quality of being able to cope with a difficult situation. <i>His films show remarkable technical</i> resourcefulness .
stubborn	Tenaciously unwilling or marked by tenacious unwillingness to yield. A stubborn refusal to learn from experience.
<u>temperance</u>	The act of tempering. The temperance movement.
tenacious	Persisting in existence; not easily dispelled. A tenacious local legend.



<u>tenacity</u>	The quality or fact of continuing to exist; persistence. You have to admire the tenacity of these two guys.
<u>unashamed</u>	Used of persons or their behavior; feeling no shame. An unashamed emotionalism.
unrepentant	Not penitent or remorseful. <i>He was unrepentant and said that his comments were completely</i> <i>accurate</i> .
unyielding	Stubbornly unyielding. His unyielding faith.
<u>vigilance</u>	The process of paying close and continuous attention. Security duties that demand long hours of vigilance .
<u>viscosity</u>	The state of being thick, sticky, and semi-fluid in consistency, due to internal friction. <i>Cooling the fluid raises its viscosity</i> .
