determination	The quality of being determined to do or achieve something; firmness of purpose. <i>Determination of molecular structures.</i>
doggedness	Persistent determination.
durability	The ability to withstand wear, pressure, or damage. <i>The reliability and durability of plastics.</i>
forbearance	Good-natured tolerance of delay or incompetence. <i>His unfailing courtesy and forbearance under great provocation.</i>
fortitude	Strength of mind that enables one to endure adversity with courage. <i>She endured her illness with great fortitude.</i>
indefatigability	Tireless determination.
longevity	The property of being long-lived. <i>The greater longevity of women compared with men.</i>
patience	The capacity to accept or tolerate delay, problems, or suffering without becoming annoyed or anxious. <i>I have run out of patience with her.</i>
permanence	The state or quality of lasting or remaining unchanged indefinitely. <i>The clarity and permanence of the dyes.</i>
perseverance	The act of persisting or persevering; continuing or repeating behavior. <i>Medicine is a field which requires dedication and perseverance.</i>
persistence	The fact of continuing in an opinion or course of action in spite of difficulty or opposition. <i>Cardiff's persistence was rewarded with a try.</i>
pertinacity	Persistent determination.
resignation	An act of resigning from a job or office. <i>He submitted his resignation as of next month.</i>
resoluteness	The trait of being resolute. <i>His resoluteness carried him through the battle.</i>
resolution	Computer science the number of pixels per square inch on a computer generated display the greater the resolution the better the picture. <i>A high resolution monitor.</i>
stamina	The ability to sustain prolonged physical or mental effort. <i>Their secret is stamina rather than speed.</i>
staying power	Brace consisting of a heavy rope or wire cable used as a support for a mast or spar.
stoicism	An indifference to pleasure or pain.

sufferance	Patient endurance especially of pain or distress. <i>An estate at sufferance.</i>
survival	The state or fact of continuing to live or exist, typically in spite of an accident, ordeal, or difficult circumstances. <i>The animal's chances of survival were pretty low.</i>
tenacity	The quality or fact of being very determined; determination. <i>The sheer tenacity of the limpet.</i>
tirelessness	Tireless determination.
tolerance	A permissible difference; allowing some freedom to move within limits. <i>The tolerance of corruption.</i>
toleration	The practice of tolerating something, in particular differences of opinion or behaviour. <i>The king demanded greater religious toleration.</i>

fortitude	Strength of mind that enables one to endure adversity with courage. <i>She endured her illness with great fortitude.</i>

hardheaded	Guided by practical experience and observation rather than theory. <i>A hardheaded appraisal of our position.</i>
hidebound	Unwilling or unable to change because of tradition or convention. <i>They are working to change hidebound corporate cultures.</i>
indomitable	Impossible to subdue. <i>A woman of indomitable spirit.</i>
intransigent	An intransigent person. <i>Her father had tried persuasion but she was intransigent.</i>
obdurate	Showing unfeeling resistance to tender feelings. <i>I argued this point with him but he was obdurate.</i>
obstinacy	The trait of being difficult to handle or overcome. <i>His reputation for obstinacy.</i>
obstinate	Tenaciously unwilling or marked by tenacious unwillingness to yield. <i>Her obstinate determination to pursue a career in radio.</i>
patience	Good-natured tolerance of delay or incompetence. <i>I have run out of patience with her.</i>
perseverance	Persistent determination. <i>Medicine is a field which requires dedication and perseverance.</i>
persistence	The fact of continuing in an opinion or course of action in spite of difficulty or opposition. <i>Cardiff's persistence was rewarded with a try.</i>
pertinacious	Stubbornly unyielding- T.S.Eliot. <i>The most vocal and pertinacious of all the critics.</i>
pertinacity	Persistent determination.
reliance	Dependence on or trust in someone or something. <i>The farmer's reliance on pesticides.</i>
resolute	Admirably purposeful, determined, and unwavering. <i>Faced with a resolute opposition.</i>
resourcefulness	The quality of being able to cope with a difficult situation. <i>His films show remarkable technical resourcefulness.</i>
stubborn	Tenaciously unwilling or marked by tenacious unwillingness to yield. <i>A stubborn refusal to learn from experience.</i>
temperance	The act of tempering. <i>The temperance movement.</i>
tenacious	Persisting in existence; not easily dispelled. <i>A tenacious local legend.</i>

tenacity

The quality or fact of continuing to exist; persistence.
*You have to admire the **tenacity** of these two guys.*

unashamed

Used of persons or their behavior; feeling no shame.
*An **unashamed** emotionalism.*

unrepentant

Not penitent or remorseful.
*He was **unrepentant** and said that his comments were completely accurate.*

unyielding

Stubbornly unyielding.
*His **unyielding** faith.*

vigilance

The process of paying close and continuous attention.
*Security duties that demand long hours of **vigilance**.*

viscosity

The state of being thick, sticky, and semi-fluid in consistency, due to internal friction.
*Cooling the fluid raises its **viscosity**.*
