
Enduring as an Adjective

Definitions of "Enduring" as an adjective

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "enduring" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Unceasing.
- Patiently bearing continual wrongs or trouble.
- Lasting a long time.
- Lasting over a period of time; durable.





Synonyms of "Enduring" as an adjective (3 Words)

abiding	Lasting a long time. An abiding belief.	
imperishable	Lasting a long time. Imperishable truths.	
long-suffering Patiently bearing continual wrongs or trouble.		





Usage Examples of "Enduring" as an adjective

- An enduring disposition.
- *He formed a number of enduring relationships with women.*





Associations of "Enduring" (30 Words)

abiding	Lasting a long time. He had an abiding respect for her.
changeless	Unvarying in nature. <i>Changeless</i> truths.
confirmed	Having been established or made firm or received the rite of confirmation. <i>A confirmed</i> invalid.
constant	Occurring continuously over a period of time. Maintained a constant temperature.
<u>continually</u>	Without interruption; constantly. This information is continually updated.
continuing	Of long duration. A continuing controversy.



continuous	Continuing in time or space without interruption- James Jeans. The whole performance is enacted in one continuous movement.
continuously	Repeatedly without exceptions or reversals. <i>These images loop continuously</i> .
discontinuance	The act of discontinuing or breaking off; an interruption (temporary or permanent.
<u>durable</u>	Capable of withstanding wear and tear and decay. Porcelain enamel is strong and durable .
endless	Having no known beginning and presumably no end. Endless waves.
<u>eternal</u>	Lasting or existing forever; without end. <i>Fear of eternal damnation.</i>
eternity	A state to which time has no application; timelessness. <i>The encounter between time and eternity.</i>
<u>ever</u>	At all times all the time and on every occasion. Nothing ever seemed to ruffle her.
everlasting	Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. <i>Life everlasting</i> .
incessant	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. The incessant beat of the music.
incessantly	With unflagging resolve. She talked about him incessantly .
indelible	Cannot be removed or erased. The story made an indelible impression on me.
ineradicable	Unable to be destroyed or removed. <i>Ineradicable</i> hostility.
interminable	Endless or apparently endless (often used hyperbolically. An interminable sermon.
<u>lasting</u>	Lasting a long time without change. A long lasting friendship.
lastingly	In an enduring or permanent manner.
permanence	The state or quality of lasting or remaining unchanged indefinitely. The clarity and permanence of the dyes.
permanency	The property of being able to exist for an indefinite duration.
<u>permanent</u>	Lasting or intended to last or remain unchanged indefinitely. Permanent secretary to the president.



perpetual	Continuing forever or indefinitely. He grows perpetual flowering carnations.
unceasing	Continuing forever or indefinitely. The unceasing efforts of the staff.
unceasingly	With unflagging resolve.
<u>unchanging</u>	Conforming to the same principles or course of action over time. The party stood for unchanging principles.
<u>unremitting</u>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. Unremitting demands of hunger.
