durable Capable of withstanding wear and tear and decay.

endless Having no known beginning and presumably no end.

Endless waves.

eternal Lasting or existing forever; without end.

Fear of **eternal** damnation.

eternity A state to which time has no application; timelessness.

The encounter between time and **eternity**.

ever At all times all the time and on every occasion.

Nothing **ever** seemed to ruffle her.

everlasting Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers.

Life **everlasting**.

incessant Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing.

The **incessant** beat of the music.

incessantly With unflagging resolve.

She talked about him **incessantly**.

indelible Cannot be removed or erased.

The story made an **indelible** impression on me.

Unable to be destroyed or removed.

ineradicable Ineradicable hostility.

interminable Endless or apparently endless (often used hyperbolically.

An **interminable** sermon.

Lasting a long time without change.

A long **lasting** friendship.

lastingly In an enduring or permanent manner.

permanenceThe state or quality of lasting or remaining unchanged indefinitely.

permanency The property of being able to exist for an indefinite duration.

Lasting or intended to last or remain unchanged indefinitely.
