Definitions of "Enduring" as an adjective

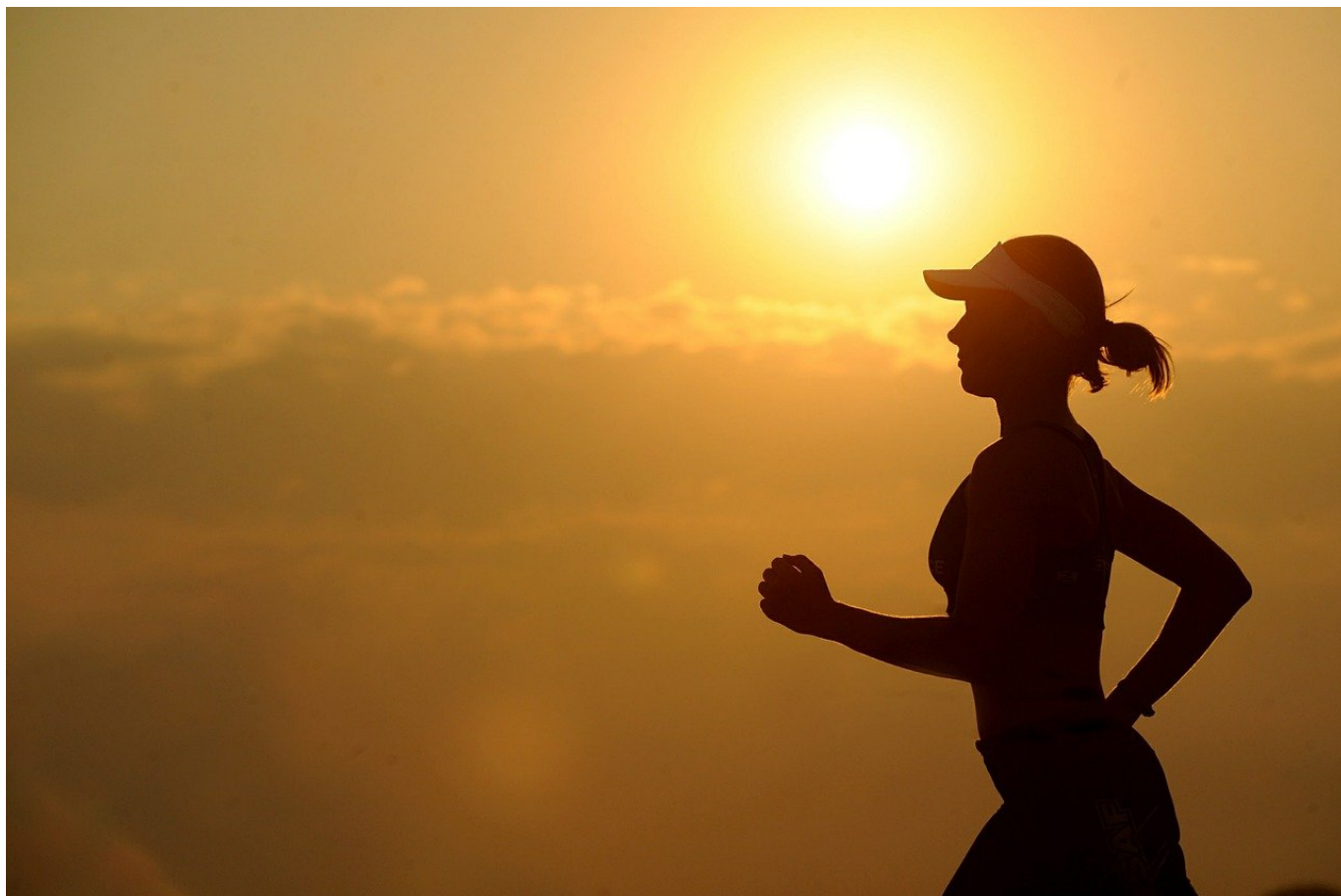
According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “enduring” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Unceasing.*
- *Patiently bearing continual wrongs or trouble.*
- *Lasting a long time.*
- *Lasting over a period of time; durable.*



Synonyms of "Enduring" as an adjective (3 Words)

- abiding** Lasting a long time.
*An **abiding** belief.*
- imperishable** Lasting a long time.
***Imperishable** truths.*
- long-suffering** Patiently bearing continual wrongs or trouble.



Usage Examples of "Enduring" as an adjective

- *An enduring disposition.*
- *He formed a number of enduring relationships with women.*



Associations of "Enduring" (30 Words)

abiding	Lasting a long time. <i>He had an abiding respect for her.</i>
changeless	Unvarying in nature. <i>Changeless truths.</i>
confirmed	Having been established or made firm or received the rite of confirmation. <i>A confirmed invalid.</i>
constant	Occurring continuously over a period of time. <i>Maintained a constant temperature.</i>
<u>continually</u>	Without interruption; constantly. <i>This information is continually updated.</i>
continuing	Of long duration. <i>A continuing controversy.</i>

continuous	Continuing in time or space without interruption- James Jeans. <i>The whole performance is enacted in one continuous movement.</i>
continuously	Repeatedly without exceptions or reversals. <i>These images loop continuously.</i>
discontinuance	The act of discontinuing or breaking off; an interruption (temporary or permanent).
<u>durable</u>	Capable of withstanding wear and tear and decay. <i>Porcelain enamel is strong and durable.</i>
endless	Having no known beginning and presumably no end. <i>Endless waves.</i>
<u>eternal</u>	Lasting or existing forever; without end. <i>Fear of eternal damnation.</i>
eternity	A state to which time has no application; timelessness. <i>The encounter between time and eternity.</i>
<u>ever</u>	At all times all the time and on every occasion. <i>Nothing ever seemed to ruffle her.</i>
everlasting	Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. <i>Life everlasting.</i>
incessant	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The incessant beat of the music.</i>
incessantly	With unflagging resolve. <i>She talked about him incessantly.</i>
indelible	Cannot be removed or erased. <i>The story made an indelible impression on me.</i>
ineradicable	Unable to be destroyed or removed. <i>Ineradicable hostility.</i>
interminable	Endless or apparently endless (often used hyperbolically). <i>An interminable sermon.</i>
<u>lasting</u>	Lasting a long time without change. <i>A long lasting friendship.</i>
lastingly	In an enduring or permanent manner.
permanence	The state or quality of lasting or remaining unchanged indefinitely. <i>The clarity and permanence of the dyes.</i>
permanency	The property of being able to exist for an indefinite duration.
<u>permanent</u>	Lasting or intended to last or remain unchanged indefinitely. <i>Permanent secretary to the president.</i>

perpetual	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>He grows perpetual flowering carnations.</i>
unceasing	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>The unceasing efforts of the staff.</i>
unceasingly	With unflagging resolve.
<u>unchanging</u>	Conforming to the same principles or course of action over time. <i>The party stood for unchanging principles.</i>
<u>unremitting</u>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Unremitting demands of hunger.</i>
