- *An armed adversary (especially a member of an opposing military force).*
- *A person who is actively opposed or hostile to someone or something.*
- *Any hostile group of people.*
- *A hostile nation or its armed forces, especially in time of war.*
- *A thing that harms or weakens something else.*
- *An opposing military force.*

- antagonist** A muscle that relaxes while another contracts.
*He turned to confront his **antagonist**.*

*A potential **challenger** for the party leadership.*
- combatant** A person engaged in conflict or competition with another.
*A long time **combatant** for the control of Newcastle FC.*
- competitor** An organization or country engaged in commercial or economic competition with others.
*Our main industrial **competitors**.*
- foe** A personal enemy.
*His work was praised by friends and **foes** alike.*

- foeman** An armed adversary (especially a member of an opposing military force).
- hostile party** Troops belonging to the enemy's military forces.
- nemesis** The inescapable agent of someone's or something's downfall.
*One risks **nemesis** by uttering such words.*
- opponent** A person who disagrees with or resists a proposal or practice.
*The news will delight **opponents** of GM foods.*
- opposer** Someone who offers opposition.
- opposition** The action of opposing something that you disapprove or disagree with.
*The invaders encountered stiff **opposition**.*
- rival** A person or thing competing with another for the same objective or for superiority in the same field of activity.
*Gun battles between **rival** gangs.*

*He vowed in silent fervour to **avenge** their murders.*

challenger	The contestant you hope to defeat. <i>A serious challenger for the title.</i>
compete	Compete for something engage in a contest measure oneself against others. <i>He competed with a number of other candidates.</i>
competitor	The contestant you hope to defeat. <i>Two competitors were banned for taking drugs.</i>
contender	The contestant you hope to defeat. <i>A presidential contender.</i>
crossfire	Fire from two or more points so that the lines of fire cross. <i>The sponsors are caught in the crossfire of the battle between the world champion and his team boss.</i>
dissent	The act of protesting a public often organized manifestation of dissent. <i>He expressed his dissent in a contrary opinion.</i>
dissident	A person who dissents from some established policy. <i>A dissident who had been jailed by a military regime.</i>
foe	An armed adversary (especially a member of an opposing military force). <i>They had been political foes for years.</i>
hostile	Showing or feeling opposition or dislike; unfriendly. <i>The brewery fought off a hostile takeover bid last year.</i>
nemesis	Retributive justice. <i>Will Harry Potter finally defeat his nemesis Voldemort.</i>
objector	A person who dissents from some established policy. <i>Objectors claim the motorway will damage the environment.</i>
opponent	Someone who competes with or opposes another in a contest, game, or argument. <i>The news will delight opponents of GM foods.</i>
oppose	Set into opposition or rivalry. <i>A majority of the electorate opposed EC membership.</i>
opposed	In conflict with or hostile to. <i>Parties opposed to the ruling party.</i>
opposing	(of two or more subjects) differing from or in conflict with each other. <i>Opponent or opposing armies.</i>
opposition	A body of people united in opposing something. <i>Her Majesty's loyal opposition.</i>
reprisal	The forcible seizure of a foreign subject or their goods as an act of retaliation. <i>The threat of reprisal.</i>
requital	An act of requiting; returning in kind.

- retaliate** Make an attack in return for a similar attack.
*They used their abilities to **retaliate** the injury.*
- retribution** The act of correcting for your wrongdoing.
*The swiftness of divine **retribution**.*
- revenge** Inflict revenge on behalf of someone else.
*It s a pity he chose that way to **revenge** his sister.*
- rival** Be the rival of be in competition with.
*He had respect for his **rivals**.*
- spurn** An act of spurning.
*He spoke gruffly as if afraid that his invitation would be **spurned**.*
- vengeance** The act of taking revenge (harming someone in retaliation for something harmful that they have done) especially in the next life.
*For **vengeance** I would do nothing This nation is too great to look for mere revenge.*
- vengeful** Seeking to harm someone in return for a perceived injury.
*A **vengeful** ex con.*
- vie** Compete eagerly with someone in order to do or achieve something.
The athletes were vying for a place in the British team.
- vindictive** Disposed to seek revenge or intended for revenge.
*More **vindictive** than jealous love.*
