## Engaged as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Engaged" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “engaged” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(of a phone line) unavailable because already in use.*
- *Involved in military hostilities.*
- *Built against or attached to a wall.*
- *Having formally agreed to marry.*
- *(of facilities such as telephones or lavatories) unavailable for use by anyone else or indicating unavailability; ('engaged' is a British term for a busy telephone line.*
- *(used of toothed parts or gears) interlocked and interacting.*
- *Having ones attention or mind or energy engaged.*
- *Busy; occupied.*
- *Unavailable for use by anyone else or indicating unavailability; ('engaged' is a British term for a busy telephone line.*
- *Reserved in advance.*
- *Having services contracted for.*
- *Interlocked and interacting.*
- *(of a toilet) already in use.*
- *(of a column) attached to or partly let into a wall.*



## Synonyms of "Engaged" as an adjective (10 Words)

<b>affianced</b>	Engaged to be married. <i>An <b>affianced</b> couple.</i>
<b>betrothed</b>	Pledged to be married.
<b>booked</b>	Reserved in advance. Of facilities such as telephones or lavatories unavailable for use by anyone else or indicating unavailability engaged is a British term for a busy telephone line.
<b>busy</b>	<i>A <b>busy</b> life.</i>
<b>in use</b>	Holding office.
<b>intermeshed</b>	Caught as if in a mesh. <i><b>Intermeshed</b> twin rotors.</i>
<b>meshed</b>	Having the form or appearance of a mesh or network. <i>A <b>meshed</b> road system.</i>
<b>occupied</b>	Resided in; having tenants. <i>The <b>occupied</b> territories.</i>

**set-aside** Reserved in advance.

**unavailable** Not available or accessible or at hand.  
*Material which is **unavailable** to the researcher.*



### Usage Examples of "Engaged" as an adjective

- *The desperately engaged ships continued the fight.*
- *Keith and I had got engaged four months before.*
- *She rang Mrs Tavett but the line was engaged.*
- *The carpenter engaged (or employed) for the job is sick.*
- *Receptionists' telephones are always engaged.*
- *Engaged columns.*
- *Deeply engaged in conversation.*
- *She was engaged to a lecturer.*
- *The newly engaged couple.*
- *The gears are engaged.*





## Associations of "Engaged" (30 Words)

<b>actively</b>	In an active manner. <i>They were <b>actively</b> engaged in supporting the war effort.</i>
<b>aggressively</b>	In a determined and forceful way. <i>Foreign owned banks are <b>aggressively</b> marketing credit cards.</i>
<u><a href="#">assassin</a></u>	A member of the Nizari branch of Ismaili Muslims at the time of the Crusades, when the newly established sect ruled part of northern Persia (1094-1256). They were renowned as militant fanatics, and were popularly reputed to use hashish before going on murder missions. <i>His <b>assassins</b> were hunted down like animals.</i>
<b>briskly</b>	In an active, quick, or energetic way. <i>We spent our day swimming in the <b>briskly</b> cold water.</i>
<u><a href="#">busy</a></u>	Of facilities such as telephones or lavatories unavailable for use by anyone else or indicating unavailability engaged is a British term for a busy telephone line. <i>Her line is <b>busy</b>.</i>
<u><a href="#">career</a></u>	The time spent by a person in a career. <i>He had a long <b>career</b> in the law.</i>
<b>certified</b>	Fit to be certified as insane and treated accordingly. <i>A <b>certified</b> accountant.</i>
<b>chartered</b>	(of an aircraft or ship) having been hired. <i>A survey was sent to 100 or the largest <b>chartered</b> corporations.</i>
<u><a href="#">cooperatively</a></u>	In close cooperation. <i>The two publishers will work <b>cooperatively</b> on poster projects.</i>
<b>diligent</b>	Quietly and steadily persevering especially in detail or exactness. <i>After <b>diligent</b> searching he found a parcel.</i>
<b>employed</b>	(of a person) having a paid job. <i>Most of our graduates are <b>employed</b>.</i>
<b>employment</b>	The occupation for which you are paid. <i>He is looking for <b>employment</b>.</i>
<b>filled</b>	Of purchase orders that have been filled. <i>Theirs was a house <b>filled</b> with laughter.</i>
<b>hire</b>	A newly hired employee. <i>They <b>hired</b> two new secretaries in the department.</i>
<b>hired</b>	Hired for the exclusive temporary use of a group of travelers. <i>A <b>hired</b> gun.</i>

<b>indefeasible</b>	Not subject to being lost, annulled, or overturned. <i>An <b>indefeasible</b> right.</i>
<b>interact</b>	Act together or towards others or with others. <i>All the stages in the process <b>interact</b>.</i>
<b>job</b>	A workplace as in the expression on the job. <i>The <b>job</b> of repairing the engine took several hours.</i>
<b>labor</b>	A social class comprising those who do manual labor or work for wages. <i>There is a shortage of skilled <b>labor</b> in this field.</i>
<b>license</b>	Grant a licence to. <i>He was <b>licensed</b> to do no more than send a message.</i>
<b>occupied</b>	Held or filled or in use. <i>She keeps her time well <b>occupied</b>.</i>
<b>overtime</b>	Payment for overtime. <i>His brain was working <b>overtime</b>.</i>
<b>partnership</b>	A position as one of the partners in a business or firm. <i>The <b>partnership</b> now owns 22 department stores.</i>
<b>professionally</b>	In a professional manner. <i>The situation was handled <b>professionally</b>.</i>
<b>pursue</b>	Seek to attain or accomplish (a goal) over a long period. <i>The officer <b>pursued</b> the van.</i>
<b>qualified</b>	Holding appropriate documentation and officially on record as qualified to perform a specified function or practice a specified skill. <i>I was less well <b>qualified</b> than almost anyone present to recollect the olden days.</i>
<b>semiskilled</b>	Possessing or requiring limited skills. <i><b>Semiskilled</b> dockworkers.</i>
<b>trained</b>	Having been taught a particular skill or type of behaviour through practice and instruction over a period of time. <i><b>Trained</b> volunteers provide a sympathetic ear and friendly advice.</i>
<b>work</b>	Be engaged in physical or mental activity in order to achieve a result do work. <i>I was returning home from <b>work</b> on a packed subway.</i>
<b>working</b>	A mine or quarry that is being or has been worked. <i>Improvements in living and <b>working</b> conditions.</i>
