| gadget | A device or control that is very useful for a particular job. <i>A variety of kitchen gadgets.</i> |
| <u>generator</u> | An electronic device for producing a signal voltage. <i>A report generator.</i> |
| implement | A tool, utensil, or other piece of equipment that is used for a particular purpose. <i>Garden implements.</i> |
| initiator | A person who initiates a course of action. |
| <u>instrument</u> | An object or device for producing musical sounds. <i>The value of learning to play a musical instrument.</i> |
| <u>invention</u> | The creation of something in the mind. <i>Medieval inventions included spectacles for reading and the spinning wheel.</i> |
| locomotive | A powered railway vehicle used for pulling trains. <i>A diesel locomotive.</i> |
| locomotive engine | A wheeled vehicle consisting of a self-propelled engine that is used to draw trains along railway tracks. |
| machine | A person who acts with the mechanical efficiency of a machine. <i>A fax machine.</i> |
| <u>mechanism</u> | (philosophy) the philosophical theory that all phenomena can be explained in terms of physical or biological causes. <i>Mechanisms of communication.</i> |

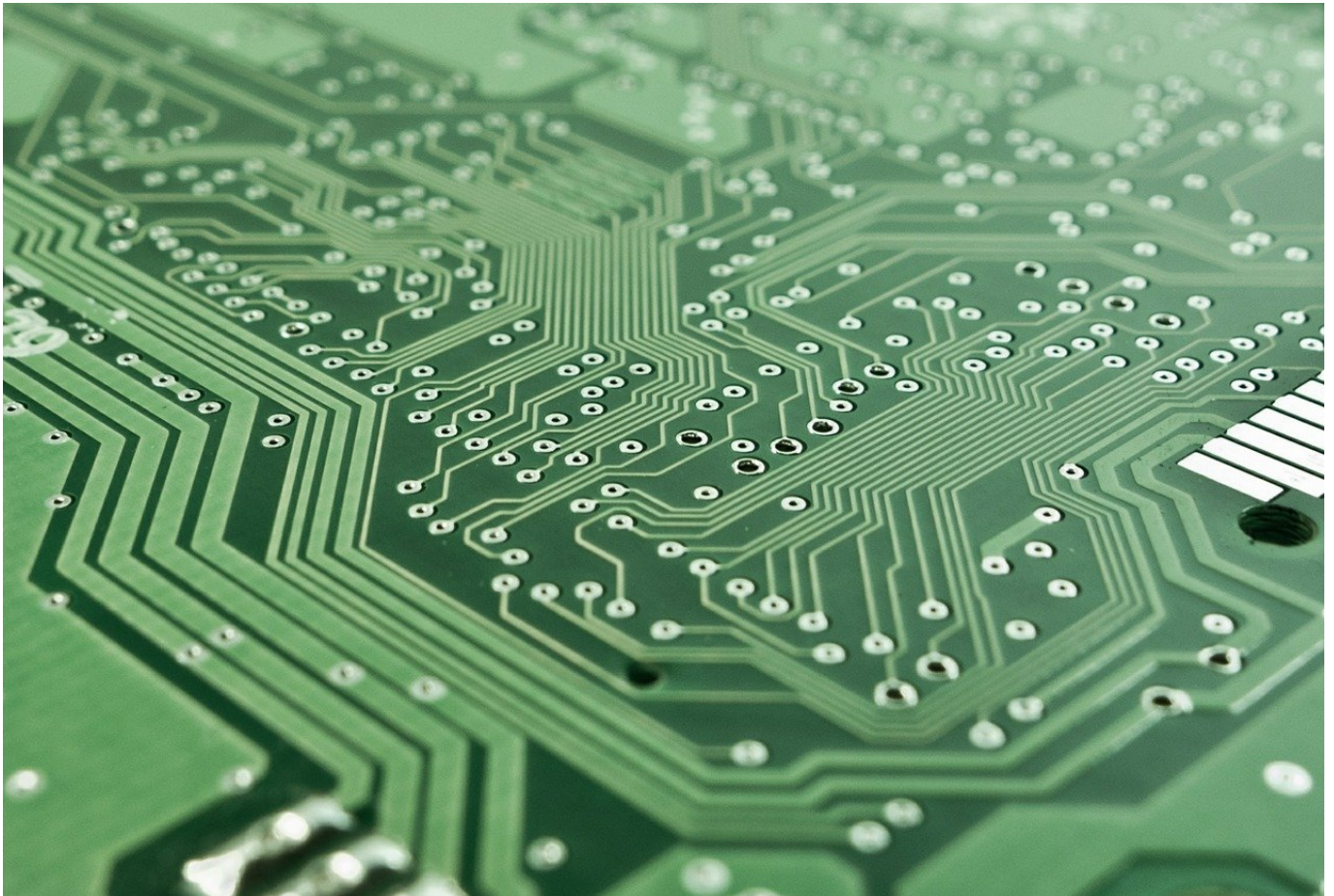

| originator | Someone who creates new things. <i>Wegener was the originator of the theory of continental drift.</i> |
| power source | Physical strength. |
| railway locomotive | Line that is the commercial organization responsible for operating a system of transportation for trains that pull passengers or freight. |
| tool | A distinct design in the tooling of a book. <i>Computers are an essential tool.</i> |
| utensil | A tool, container, or other article, especially for household use. <i>Kitchen utensils.</i> |

| aerospace | The atmosphere and outer space considered as a whole. |
| aircraft | A vehicle that can fly. |
| antifreeze | A liquid, typically one based on ethylene glycol, that can be added to water to lower the freezing point, chiefly used in the radiator of a motor vehicle. <i>Formulating antifreezes and de icers for railways is no easy job.</i> |
| ballooning | The sport or pastime of flying in a balloon. <i>He took up ballooning in 1907.</i> |
| carriage | Any of the separate sections of a train that carry passengers. <i>A horse drawn carriage.</i> |

| <u>carrier</u> | An aircraft carrier. <i>The instruments can be sent by carrier.</i> |
| coolant | A fluid agent (gas or liquid) that produces cooling; especially one used to cool a system by transferring heat away from one part to another. <i>Lathe operators use an emulsion of oil and water as a coolant for the cutting tool.</i> |
| diesel | German engineer born in France who invented the diesel engine 1858 1913. <i>Eleven litres of diesel.</i> |
| distillate | Something formed by distillation. <i>Natural gas mixed with distillate.</i> |
| equipage | The equipment for a particular purpose. |
| flotilla | A fleet of small craft. <i>A flotilla of cargo boats.</i> |
| <u>generator</u> | A point, line, or surface regarded as moving and so notionally forming a line, surface, or solid. <i>A report generator.</i> |
| jet | An aircraft powered by one or more jet engines. <i>A private jet.</i> |
| lander | A spacecraft designed to land on the surface of a planet or moon. <i>A lunar lander.</i> |
| liter | A metric unit of capacity, formerly defined as the volume of one kilogram of pure water under standard conditions; now equal to 1,000 cubic centimeters (or approximately 1.75 pints). |
| locomotive | Of or relating to locomotion. <i>Locomotive bivalves have the strongest hinges.</i> |
| maneuverable | Capable of maneuvering or changing position. <i>A highly maneuverable ship.</i> |
| motor | Travel in a motor vehicle. <i>Motor insurance.</i> |
| mounted | Assembled for use; especially by being attached to a support. <i>The trim brass mounted carbine of the ranger.</i> |
| newsboy | A boy who sells or delivers newspapers. |
| propeller | A mechanical device for propelling a boat or aircraft, consisting of a revolving shaft with two or more broad, angled blades attached to it. |
| propulsion | The act of propelling. <i>They dive and use their wings for propulsion under water.</i> |

| vaporizer | A device that puts out a substance in the form of a vapor (especially for medicinal inhalation). |
