planner	A person who makes plans. My day planner .
producer	Someone who manufactures something. <i>He s the executive producer of weekday daytime shows.</i>
railroad engineer	Line that is the commercial organization responsible for operating a system of transportation for trains that pull passengers or freight.
technologist	A person who uses scientific knowledge to solve practical problems. A laboratory technologist .



<u>concoct</u>	Make a concoction of by mixing. His cronies concoct ed a simple plan.
conduct	Transmit a form of energy such as heat or electricity by conduction. <i>He conducted us to the palace.</i>



contrive	Make or work out a plan for; devise. You contrive d to be alone with me despite the supervision.
control	Control others or oneself or influence skillfully usually to one s advantage. <i>Do you control these data.</i>
coordinate	Form a coordinate bond to an atom or molecule. The stud fastenings are coloured to coordinate with the shirt.
<u>devise</u>	Plan or invent (a complex procedure, system, or mechanism) by careful thought. A training programme should be devise d.
direct	Aim something in a particular direction or at a particular person. Can you direct me to the railway station please.
fix	Make fixed stable or stationary. Her gaze fix ed on Jess.
form	Give shape or form to. To form a judgement he seeks further in form ation.
<u>formulate</u>	Express (an idea) in a concise or systematic way. The government has formulate d a policy on waste management.
handle	Handle effectively. The first penalty came as Brown handle d.
manage	Be the manager of a sports team or a performer. We manage our cash extremely well.
<u>manipulate</u>	Manipulate in a fraudulent manner. He manipulate d public opinion in his favor.
manoeuvre	Direct the course; determine the direction of travelling. She tried to manoeuvre her trolley round people.
mastermind	Plan and direct (a complex undertaking. <i>He was accused of masterminding a gold smuggling racket.</i>
<u>mobilize</u>	Bring (resources) into use for a particular purpose. At sea we will mobilize any amount of resources to undertake a rescue.
mount	Go upward with gradual or continuous progress. <i>He mounted the steps.</i>
negotiate	Transfer (a cheque, bill, or other document) to the legal ownership of another person, who thus becomes entitled to any benefit. <i>They negotiate the sale of the house.</i>
<u>orchestrate</u>	Plan or coordinate the elements of (a situation) to produce a desired effect, especially surreptitiously. <i>The situation has been orchestrated by a tiny minority.</i>



organise	Bring order and organization to.
<u>organize</u>	Make arrangements or preparations for (an event or activity. She was unsuited to anything where she had to organize herself.
<u>originate</u>	Bring into being. A new religious movement originate d in that country.
plan	Design or make a plan of something to be made or built. He plan s to be in graduate school next year.
<u>plot</u>	Devise the sequence of events in (a literary work or a play, movie, or ballet. <i>A cooling curve is plotted and the freezing point determined.</i>
pull off	Strip of feathers.
put on	Attribute or give.
put together	Formulate in a particular style or language.
scheme	Arrange according to a colour scheme. I scheme it could work.
set up	Make ready or suitable or equip in advance for a particular purpose or for some use, event, etc.
<u>stage</u>	Diagnose or classify a disease or patient as having reached a particular stage in the expected progression of the disease. The show is being stage d at the Grand Opera House in Belfast.
superintend	Watch and direct. He superintend ed a land reclamation scheme.

assembler	A program to convert assembly language into machine language.

climatologist	Someone who is expert in climatology.
electrician	A person who installs and maintains electrical equipment.

machinist	A person who operates a machine, especially a machine tool or a sewing machine.
<u>mechanic</u>	Resembling the action of a machine- Emily Dickenson. From blank to blank a threadless way I pushed mechanic feet.
operator	A shrewd or unscrupulous person who knows how to circumvent difficulties. <i>Who is the operator of this franchise.</i>
plumber	A person who fits and repairs the pipes, fittings, and other apparatus of water supply, sanitation, or heating systems.
referee	Be a referee or umpire in a sports competition. The subject of a bad reference can sue the referee for libel.
repairman	A person who repairs vehicles, machinery, or appliances. A TV repairman .
<u>scientist</u>	A person who is studying or has expert knowledge of one or more of the natural or physical sciences. A research scientist .
sculptor	A faint constellation in the southern hemisphere near Phoenix and Cetus.
technician	A person skilled in the technique of an art or craft. A laboratory technician .
technique	A way of carrying out a particular task, especially the execution or performance of an artistic work or a scientific procedure. <i>He has excellent technique</i> .



technology	The branch of knowledge dealing with engineering or applied sciences. <i>Advances in computer technology.</i>
toolmaker	A maker of tools, especially a person who makes and maintains tools for use in a manufacturing process.
