## Associations of "Engineered" (30 Words)

<a href="#">architect</a>	Someone who creates plans to be used in making something (such as buildings). <i>An <b>architected</b> information interface.</i>
<b>assembler</b>	A program to convert assembly language into machine language.
<a href="#">carpenter</a>	Do the work of a carpenter. <i>She <b>carpenters</b> and goes on archaeological digs.</i>
<b>climatologist</b>	Someone who is expert in climatology.
<b>electrician</b>	A person who installs or repairs electrical or telephone lines.
<b>embedded</b>	(of an object) fixed firmly and deeply in a surrounding mass; implanted. <i>Peach and plum seeds <b>embedded</b> in a sweet edible pulp.</i>
<a href="#">engineering</a>	A room (as on a ship) in which the engine is located. <i>If not for his shrewd <b>engineering</b> the election would have been lost.</i>
<b>experimenter</b>	A person who tries out new ideas, methods, or activities. <i>Early <b>experimenters</b> with structure and harmony.</i>
<b>fix</b>	Decide upon or fix definitely. <i>Making everything easier for the car driver would only be a short term <b>fix</b>.</i>
<b>industry</b>	The organized action of making of goods and services for sale. <i>The kitchen became a hive of <b>industry</b>.</i>
<a href="#">invent</a>	Make up something artificial or untrue. <i>He <b>invented</b> an improved form of the steam engine.</i>
<a href="#">inventor</a>	A person who invented a particular process or device or who invents things as an occupation.
<b>linesman</b>	Official (in tennis, soccer, football, etc.) who assists the referee in some way (especially by watching for out of bounds or offside).
<b>machine</b>	Make or operate on with a machine. <i>Comedians are more than just laugh <b>machines</b>.</i>

<b>machinist</b>	A person who operates a machine, especially a machine tool or a sewing machine.
<b><u>mechanic</u></b>	Resembling the action of a machine. <i>From blank to blank a threadless way I pushed <b>mechanic</b> feet.</i>
<b>operator</b>	A symbol or function representing a mathematical operation. <i>Her reputation as a cool clever <b>operator</b>.</i>
<b>plumber</b>	A person who fits and repairs the pipes, fittings, and other apparatus of water supply, sanitation, or heating systems.
<b>referee</b>	Act as the referee of. <i>He <b>refereed</b> two of the first round group matches.</i>
<b>repairman</b>	A skilled worker whose job is to repair things. <i>A TV <b>repairman</b>.</i>
<b><u>scientist</u></b>	A person who is studying or has expert knowledge of one or more of the natural or physical sciences. <i>A research <b>scientist</b>.</i>
<b>sculptor</b>	A faint constellation in the southern hemisphere near Phoenix and Cetus.
<b>technician</b>	An expert in the practical application of a science. <i>Liszt was one of the greatest piano <b>technicians</b> of all time.</i>
<b>technique</b>	Skillfulness in the command of fundamentals deriving from practice and familiarity. <i>He has excellent <b>technique</b>.</i>
<b>technology</b>	The application of the knowledge and usage of tools (such as machines or utensils) and techniques to control one's environment. <i>Advances in computer <b>technology</b>.</i>
<b>toolmaker</b>	A maker of tools, especially a person who makes and maintains tools for use in a manufacturing process.
<b>umpire</b>	Be a referee or umpire in a sports competition. <i>He <b>umpired</b> the World Cup final.</i>
<b>welder</b>	A person who welds metal. <i>He worked as a <b>welder</b> in a steel factory.</i>
<b>wire</b>	A wire stretched across and above the start and finish of a racecourse. <i>A <b>wire</b> coat hanger.</i>
<b>wiring</b>	The installation of electric wiring. <i>Civilizations have put nothing into the basic <b>wiring</b> of the human animal.</i>
