Associations of "Engineered" (30 Words)

architect	Someone who creates plans to be used in making something (such as buildings). <i>An architected information interface.</i>
assembler	A program to convert assembly language into machine language.
carpenter	Do the work of a carpenter. <i>She carpenters and goes on archaeological digs.</i>
climatologist	Someone who is expert in climatology.
electrician	A person who installs or repairs electrical or telephone lines.
embedded	(of an object) fixed firmly and deeply in a surrounding mass; implanted. <i>Peach and plum seeds embedded in a sweet edible pulp.</i>
engineering	A room (as on a ship) in which the engine is located. <i>If not for his shrewd engineering the election would have been lost.</i>
experimenter	A person who tries out new ideas, methods, or activities. <i>Early experimenters with structure and harmony.</i>
fix	Decide upon or fix definitely. <i>Making everything easier for the car driver would only be a short term fix.</i>
industry	The organized action of making of goods and services for sale. <i>The kitchen became a hive of industry.</i>
invent	Make up something artificial or untrue. <i>He invented an improved form of the steam engine.</i>
inventor	A person who invented a particular process or device or who invents things as an occupation.
linesman	Official (in tennis, soccer, football, etc.) who assists the referee in some way (especially by watching for out of bounds or offside).
machine	Make or operate on with a machine. <i>Comedians are more than just laugh machines.</i>

machinist	A person who operates a machine, especially a machine tool or a sewing machine.
<u>mechanic</u>	Resembling the action of a machine. <i>From blank to blank a threadless way I pushed mechanic feet.</i>
operator	A symbol or function representing a mathematical operation. <i>Her reputation as a cool clever operator.</i>
plumber	A person who fits and repairs the pipes, fittings, and other apparatus of water supply, sanitation, or heating systems.
referee	Act as the referee of. <i>He refereed two of the first round group matches.</i>
repairman	A skilled worker whose job is to repair things. <i>A TV repairman.</i>
<u>scientist</u>	A person who is studying or has expert knowledge of one or more of the natural or physical sciences. <i>A research scientist.</i>
sculptor	A faint constellation in the southern hemisphere near Phoenix and Cetus.
technician	An expert in the practical application of a science. <i>Liszt was one of the greatest piano technicians of all time.</i>
technique	Skillfulness in the command of fundamentals deriving from practice and familiarity. <i>He has excellent technique.</i>
technology	The application of the knowledge and usage of tools (such as machines or utensils) and techniques to control one's environment. <i>Advances in computer technology.</i>
toolmaker	A maker of tools, especially a person who makes and maintains tools for use in a manufacturing process.
umpire	Be a referee or umpire in a sports competition. <i>He umpired the World Cup final.</i>
welder	A person who welds metal. <i>He worked as a welder in a steel factory.</i>
wire	A wire stretched across and above the start and finish of a racecourse. <i>A wire coat hanger.</i>
wiring	The installation of electric wiring. <i>Civilizations have put nothing into the basic wiring of the human animal.</i>
