## Engrave as a Verb

### Definitions of "Engrave" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “engrave” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Carve or cut a design or letters into.*
- *Cut (a design) as lines on a metal plate for printing.*
- *Be permanently fixed in (one's memory or mind.*
- *Carve or cut into a block used for printing or print from such a block.*
- *Carve, cut, or etch into a material or surface.*
- *Cut or carve (a text or design) on the surface of a hard object.*
- *Cut or carve a text or design on (a hard object.*
- *Impress or affect deeply.*



## Synonyms of "Engrave" as a verb (25 Words)

- brand** Assign a brand name to.  
*When this product is not **branded** it sells for a lower price.*
- carve** Cut (a slice of meat) from a larger piece.  
*Father **carved** the ham.*
- chase** Seek to attain.  
***Chase** silver.*
- chisel** Cut or shape something with a chisel.  
***Chisel** a hole through the brickwork.*
- cut** Cut off the testicles of male animals such as horses.  
*Mark the point where the line **cuts** the vertical axis.*
- cut in** Cut down on; make a reduction in.
- deboss** Stamp a design into the surface of (an object).  
*A blue awareness bracelet with a **debossed** logo.*

<b>embed</b>	Implant (an idea or feeling) so that it becomes ingrained within a particular context. <i>The young reporter was <b>embedded</b> with the Third Division.</i>
<b>etch</b>	Use the etching process to produce a print or design. <i>A Pictish stone <b>etched</b> with mysterious designs.</i>
<b>fix</b>	Decide upon or fix definitely. <i>Ruth <b>fixed</b> herself a cold drink.</i>
<b>grave</b>	Shape (a material like stone or wood) by whittling away at it. <i>En<b>graved</b> the trophy cup with the winner s name.</i>
<b>impress</b>	Produce or try to produce a vivid impression of. <i>The young chess player <b>impressed</b> her audience.</i>
<b>imprint</b>	Establish or impress firmly in the mind. <i>He d always have this ghastly image <b>imprinted</b> on his mind.</i>
<b>incise</b>	Make an incision into by carving or cutting. <i>Figures <b>incised</b> on upright stones.</i>
<b>ingrain</b>	Firmly fix or establish (a habit, belief, or attitude) in a person. <i>Mother tried to <b>ingrain</b> respect for our elders in us.</i>
<b>inscribe</b>	Write or carve (words or symbols) on something, especially as a formal or permanent record. <i>His name was <b>inscribed</b> on the new silver trophy.</i>
<b>lodge</b>	Be a lodger stay temporarily. <i>The variety is high yielding but it has mostly <b>lodged</b>.</i>
<b>mark</b>	Insert punctuation marks into. <i>The examiner may have hundreds of scripts to <b>mark</b>.</i>
<b>print</b>	Write as if with print not cursive. <i>A delicate fabric <b>printed</b> with roses.</i>
<b>record</b>	Make a record of set down in permanent form. <i>I would go into the studio while the guys were <b>recording</b>.</i>
<b>register</b>	Send by registered mail. <i>He hadn t even <b>registered</b> her presence.</i>
<b>score</b>	Decide on the scores to be awarded in a match or competition. <i>Did you <b>score</b> last night.</i>
<b>scratch</b>	Play a record using the scratch technique. <i>Her arms were <b>scratched</b> by the thorns.</i>
<b>set</b>	Set to a certain position or cause to operate correctly. <i>The unions had <b>set</b> a limit on the size of the temporary workforce.</i>



**stamp** Affix a stamp to.  
*He must be able to **stamp** his authority on the team.*





## Usage Examples of "Engrave" as a verb

- *Engraved the trophy cup with the winner's name.*
- *His drawings of public buildings were engraved by Edward Rooker.*
- *Engrave a pen.*
- *Engrave a letter.*
- *The image would be forever engraved in his memory.*
- *The crystal glasses were engraved with the Queen's cipher.*
- *My name was engraved on the ring.*
- *The event engraved itself into her memory.*
- *Engrave the pen with the owner's name.*



## Associations of "Engrave" (30 Words)

### carve

Make (a turn) by tilting one's skis on to their edges and using one's weight to bend them so that they slide in an arc.

*The wood was **carved** with runes.*

<b>caryatid</b>	A stone carving of a draped female figure, used as a pillar to support the entablature of a Greek or Greek-style building.
<b>chisel</b>	Carve with a chisel. <i>He s <b>chiselled</b> me out of my dues.</i>
<b>commemorate</b>	Mark or celebrate (an event or person) by doing or producing something. <i>A wreath laying ceremony to <b>commemorate</b> the war dead.</i>
<b>cut</b>	A passage cut or dug out as a railway cutting or a new channel made for a river or other waterway. <i>The Vietnamese <b>cut</b> a lot of timber while they occupied Cambodia.</i>
<b>deep</b>	A deep part of the sea. <i>Waist <b>deep</b>.</i>
<b>effigy</b>	A roughly made model of a person that is made in order to be damaged or destroyed as a protest. <i>Angry campaigners plan to burn an <b>effigy</b> of the social security minister.</i>
<b>emblazon</b>	Decorate with heraldic arms. <i>The Queen s coat of arms is <b>emblazoned</b> on the door panel.</i>
<b>engraved</b>	Cut or impressed into a surface. <i><b>Engraved</b> invitations.</i>
<b>enter</b>	Set out on an enterprise or subject of study. <i>The door opened and Karl <b>entered</b>.</i>
<b>etch</b>	Make an etching of. <i>Caustic soda <b>etches</b> glass.</i>
<b>gargoyle</b>	An ornament consisting of a grotesquely carved figure of a person or animal.
<b>gouge</b>	The act of gouging. <i>The channel had been <b>gouged</b> out by the ebbing water.</i>
<b>incise</b>	Cut (skin or flesh) with a surgical instrument. <i>A button <b>incised</b> with a skull.</i>
<b>inscribe</b>	Address, (a work of literature) in a style less formal than a dedication. <i>His name was <b>inscribed</b> on the new silver trophy.</i>
<b>mallet</b>	A hammer with a large, usually wooden head.
<b>marble</b>	A sculpture carved from marble. <i>A pair of dramatic <b>marbles</b> showing dogs attacking a buck.</i>
<b>memorial</b>	A structure erected to commemorate persons or events. <i>A <b>memorial</b> to General Robert E Lee.</i>
<b>memorialize</b>	Address in a memorial. <i>The President <b>memorialized</b> the heroes of the battle.</i>



<b><u>monolithic</u></b>	Characterized by massiveness and rigidity and total uniformity. <i>IPC moved the paper from Covent Garden to the <b>monolithic</b> King's Reach Tower.</i>
<b><u>monument</u></b>	An important site that is marked and preserved as public property. <i>A simple stone <b>monument</b> marked the nearby crash site.</i>
<b>monumental</b>	Imposing in size or bulk or solidity. <i>Einstein's <b>monumental</b> contributions to physics.</i>
<b>plaque</b>	An ornamental tablet, typically of metal, porcelain, or wood, that is fixed to a wall or other surface in commemoration of a person or event. <i><b>Plaque</b> around gum margins can lead to gingivitis.</i>
<b>sculpt</b>	Create or represent (something) by carving, casting, or other shaping techniques. <i><b>Sculpting</b> human figures from ivory.</i>
<b><u>sculpture</u></b>	Form or shape as if by sculpture especially with strong smooth curves. <i>Ammonite shells with external <b>sculpture</b> near the aperture.</i>
<b>slab</b>	Remove slabs from a log or tree to prepare it for sawing into planks. <i>He handled the rope competently and set out up the centre of the <b>slab</b>.</i>
<b><u>statue</u></b>	A sculpture representing a human or animal.
<b><u>stone</u></b>	Build face or pave with stone. <i>He must have a heart of <b>stone</b>.</i>
<b><u>tomb</u></b>	A place for the burial of a corpse especially beneath the ground and marked by a tombstone. <i>None escape the <b>tomb</b>.</i>
<b>totem</b>	A clan or tribe identified by their kinship to a common totemic object. <i>Other radical groups look to the party as a <b>totem</b> of the anti austerity movement.</i>
