According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "engrave" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- Carve or cut a design or letters into.
- *Cut (a design) as lines on a metal plate for printing.*
- Be permanently fixed in (one's memory or mind.
- Carve or cut into a block used for printing or print from such a block.
- Carve, cut, or etch into a material or surface.
- Cut or carve (a text or design) on the surface of a hard object.
- Cut or carve a text or design on (a hard object.
- Impress or affect deeply.





Synonyms of "Engrave" as a verb (25 Words)


brand	Assign a brand name to. When this product is not brand ed it sells for a lower price.
<u>carve</u>	Cut (a slice of meat) from a larger piece. Father carve d the ham.
chase	Seek to attain. <i>Chase silver.</i>
<u>chisel</u>	Cut or shape something with a chisel. <i>Chisel</i> a hole through the brickwork.
cut	Cut off the testicles of male animals such as horses. Mark the point where the line cut s the vertical axis.
cut in	Cut down on; make a reduction in.
deboss	Stamp a design into the surface of (an object. A blue awareness bracelet with a deboss ed logo.



embed	Implant (an idea or feeling) so that it becomes ingrained within a particular context. The young reporter was embed ded with the Third Division.
etch	Use the etching process to produce a print or design. A Pictish stone etch ed with mysterious designs.
fix	Decide upon or fix definitely. Ruth fix ed herself a cold drink.
<u>grave</u>	Shape (a material like stone or wood) by whittling away at it. En grave d the trophy cup with the winner s name.
<u>impress</u>	Produce or try to produce a vivid impression of. The young chess player impress ed her audience.
<u>imprint</u>	Establish or impress firmly in the mind. He d always have this ghastly image imprint ed on his mind.
incise	Make an incision into by carving or cutting. Figures incise d on upright stones.
ingrain	Firmly fix or establish (a habit, belief, or attitude) in a person. Mother tried to ingrain respect for our elders in us.
inscribe	Write or carve (words or symbols) on something, especially as a formal or permanent record. His name was inscribe d on the new silver trophy.
lodge	Be a lodger stay temporarily. The variety is high yielding but it has mostly lodge d.
mark	Insert punctuation marks into. The examiner may have hundreds of scripts to mark .
print	Write as if with print not cursive. A delicate fabric print ed with roses.
record	Make a record of set down in permanent form. I would go into the studio while the guys were record ing.
<u>register</u>	Send by registered mail. He hadn t even register ed her presence.
score	Decide on the scores to be awarded in a match or competition. Did you score last night.
<u>scratch</u>	Play a record using the scratch technique. <i>Her arms were scratched by the thorns.</i>
set	Set to a certain position or cause to operate correctly. The unions had set a limit on the size of the temporary workforce.



stamp Affix a stamp to. *He must be able to stamp his authority on the team.*





Usage Examples of "Engrave" as a verb

- Engraved the trophy cup with the winner's name.
- His drawings of public buildings were engraved by Edward Rooker.
- Engrave a pen.
- Engrave a letter.
- The image would be forever engraved in his memory.
- The crystal glasses were engraved with the Queen's cipher.
- My name was engraved on the ring.
- The event engraved itself into her memory.
- Engrave the pen with the owner's name.



Associations of "Engrave" (30 Words)

<u>carve</u>

Make (a turn) by tilting one's skis on to their edges and using one's weight to bend them so that they slide in an arc. *The wood was carved with runes.*



caryatid	A stone carving of a draped female figure, used as a pillar to support the entablature of a Greek or Greek-style building.
<u>chisel</u>	Carve with a chisel. <i>He s chiselled me out of my dues.</i>
<u>commemorate</u>	Mark or celebrate (an event or person) by doing or producing something. <i>A wreath laying ceremony to commemorate the war dead.</i>
cut	A passage cut or dug out as a railway cutting or a new channel made for a river or other waterway. The Vietnamese cut a lot of timber while they occupied Cambodia.
deep	A deep part of the sea. Waist deep .
effigy	A roughly made model of a person that is made in order to be damaged or destroyed as a protest. Angry campaigners plan to burn an effigy of the social security minister.
emblazon	Decorate with heraldic arms. The Queen s coat of arms is emblazon ed on the door panel.
<u>engraved</u>	Cut or impressed into a surface. <i>Engraved</i> invitations.
enter	Set out on an enterprise or subject of study. The door opened and Karl enter ed.
etch	Make an etching of. <i>Caustic soda etches glass.</i>
gargoyle	An ornament consisting of a grotesquely carved figure of a person or animal.
gouge	The act of gouging. The channel had been gouge d out by the ebbing water.
incise	Cut (skin or flesh) with a surgical instrument. A button incise d with a skull.
inscribe	Address, (a work of literature) in a style less formal than a dedication. <i>His name was inscribed on the new silver trophy.</i>
mallet	A hammer with a large, usually wooden head.
marble	A sculpture carved from marble. A pair of dramatic marble s showing dogs attacking a buck.
<u>memorial</u>	A structure erected to commemorate persons or events. A memorial to General Robert E Lee.
memorialize	Address in a memorial. The President memorialize d the heroes of the battle.



<u>monolithic</u>	Characterized by massiveness and rigidity and total uniformity. IPC moved the paper from Covent Garden to the monolithic King s Reach Tower.
<u>monument</u>	An important site that is marked and preserved as public property. A simple stone monument marked the nearby crash site.
monumental	Imposing in size or bulk or solidity. Einstein s monumental contributions to physics.
plaque	An ornamental tablet, typically of metal, porcelain, or wood, that is fixed to a wall or other surface in commemoration of a person or event. Plaque around gum margins can lead to gingivitis.
sculpt	Create or represent (something) by carving, casting, or other shaping techniques. <i>Sculpt</i> ing human figures from ivory.
<u>sculpture</u>	Form or shape as if by sculpture especially with strong smooth curves. Ammonite shells with external sculpture near the aperture.
slab	Remove slabs from a log or tree to prepare it for sawing into planks. <i>He handled the rope competently and set out up the centre of the slab</i> .
<u>statue</u>	A sculpture representing a human or animal.
<u>stone</u>	Build face or pave with stone. <i>He must have a heart of stone.</i>
<u>tomb</u>	A place for the burial of a corpse especially beneath the ground and marked by a tombstone. <i>None escape the tomb</i> .
totem	A clan or tribe identified by their kinship to a common totemic object. Other radical groups look to the party as a totem of the anti austerity movement.
