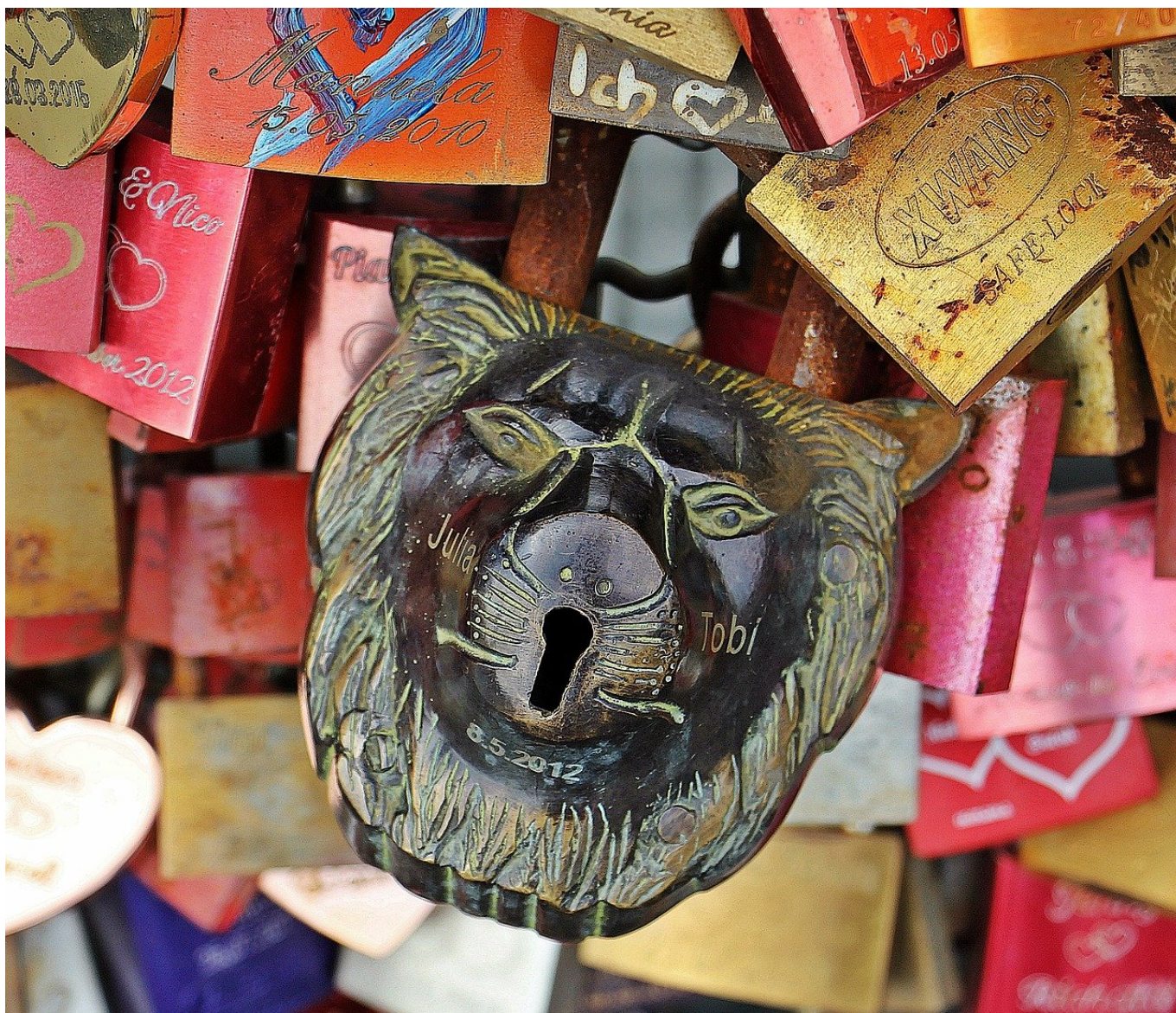
The synonyms of “Engraved” are: etched, graven, incised, inscribed

Definitions of "Engraved" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “engraved” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Cut or impressed into a surface.*



Synonyms of "Engraved" as an adjective (4 Words)

etched

Cut or impressed into a surface.
Etched glass windows.

graven

Cut or impressed into a surface.
Graven images.

incised

Sharply and deeply indented.
An **incised** design.

(of loan stock) issued in the form of shares whose holders are listed in a register
inscribed rather than issued with certificates.
An ***inscribed*** watch.



Usage Examples of "Engraved" as an adjective

- *Engraved invitations.*



Associations of "Engraved" (30 Words)

abbreviated	Cut short in duration. <i>The abbreviated speech.</i>
<u>abridge</u>	Curtail (a right or privilege). <i>The new law might abridge our freedom of expression.</i>
<u>briefly</u>	For a short time. <i>As I briefly mentioned earlier.</i>
<u>cartoon</u>	Draw cartoons of. <i>We watched Yogi Bear cartoons on TV.</i>
concisely	In a concise manner; in a few words. <i>The history is summed up concisely in this book.</i>
<u>concrete</u>	Cover an area with concrete. <i>The precious English countryside may soon be concreted over.</i>

contour	Mark a map or diagram with contour lines. <i>It defines a major contour of this administration.</i>
delineate	Show the form or outline of. <i>His finger found a precisely outlined section delineated in red marker.</i>
divergent	Diverging from another or from a standard. <i>Divergent interpretations.</i>
doodle	Make a doodle draw aimlessly. <i>The text was interspersed with doodles.</i>
draft	Select a player for a sports team through the draft. <i>A draft document.</i>
draw	The act of drawing or hauling something. <i>This chimney draws very well.</i>
encapsulate	Enclose in a capsule or other small container. <i>The company would encapsulate the asbestos waste in concrete pellets.</i>
incised	Cut into with a sharp instrument. <i>An incised design.</i>
outline	Draw up an outline or sketch for something. <i>An outline proposal.</i>
plaque	A sticky deposit on teeth in which bacteria proliferate. <i>Plaque around gum margins can lead to gingivitis.</i>
precis	Make a precis of a text or speech.
profile	Represent in profile by drawing or painting. <i>In soft rocks a profile drawn normally to the beach would show a concave form comparable with the long profile of a river.</i>
prospectus	A printed booklet advertising a school or university to potential parents or students or giving details of a share offer for the benefit of investors. <i>A prospectus should contain the facts that an investor needs to make an informed decision.</i>
recapitulate	Summarize briefly. <i>He began to recapitulate his argument with care.</i>
resume	Take up or begin anew. <i>The painting resumed its old condition when we restored it.</i>
scribble	Write or draw (something) carelessly or hurriedly. <i>Illegible scribbles.</i>
sketch	Make a sketch of. <i>Sketch the outline of the book.</i>

<u>sketchy</u>	Giving only major points; lacking completeness. A sketchy account.
slab	Remove slabs from a log or tree to prepare it for sawing into planks. Paving slabs .
<u>summarize</u>	Give a brief statement of the main points of (something). To summarize there are three main categories.
summary	A brief statement or account of the main points of something. A summary of Chapter Three.
<u>synopsis</u>	A brief summary or general survey of something. A synopsis of the insurance cover provided is set out below.
<u>valley</u>	An internal angle formed by the intersecting planes of a roof, or by the slope of a roof and a wall. The valley floor.
<u>vignette</u>	Portray someone in the style of a vignette. A classic vignette of embassy life.
