- *Written formally in a large clear script, as a deed or other legal document.*




## Synonyms of "Engrossed" as an adjective (5 Words)

- captive** Imprisoned or confined.  
*Advertisements at the cinema reach a **captive** audience.*
- enwrapped** Giving or marked by complete attention to.  
***Enwrapped** in dreams.*
- intent** Determined to do (something).  
*So **intent** on this fantastic narrative that she hardly stirred.*
- wrapped** Overjoyed; delighted.  
***Enwrapped** in dreams.*

## Associations of "Engrossed" (30 Words)

<b>absorbed</b>	Having one's attention fully engaged; greatly interested. <i>He was gazing into the water with <b>absorbed</b> attention.</i>
<b><u>captive</u></b>	(of a facility or service) controlled by, and typically for the sole use of, an organization. <i>The policeman put a pair of handcuffs on the <b>captive</b>.</i>
<b>committal</b>	The act of committing a crime. <i><b>Committal</b> proceedings.</i>

<u>concentration</u>	Strengthening the concentration as of a solute in a mixture by removing diluting material. <b>Concentration</b> on the needs of the young can mean that the elderly are forgotten.
concerned	Feeling or showing worry or solicitude. We feel <b>concerned</b> about accomplishing the task at hand.
confined	(of a space) restricted in area or volume; cramped. Her fear of <b>confined</b> spaces.
confinement	Concluding state of pregnancy; from the onset of contractions to the birth of a child. He was immediately released from his <b>confinement</b> .
<u>considerate</u>	Showing careful thought. She was unfailingly kind and <b>considerate</b> .
<u>contemplative</u>	A person devoted to the contemplative life. <b>Contemplative</b> knowledge of God.
<u>culprit</u>	Someone who perpetrates wrongdoing. The car's front nearside door had been smashed in but the <b>culprits</b> had fled.
daydream	Indulge in a daydream. Stop <b>daydreaming</b> and pay attention.
<u>ecstatic</u>	Involving an experience of mystic self-transcendence. An <b>ecstatic</b> vision of God.
<u>enraptured</u>	Feeling great rapture or delight.
focus	Place the focus on an element of a sentence. They were <b>focusing</b> a telescope on a star.
<u>imprisonment</u>	Putting someone in prison or in jail as lawful punishment. The <b>imprisonment</b> of captured soldiers.
intent	Intention or purpose. His <b>intent</b> was to provide a new translation.
<u>joyous</u>	Full of happiness and joy. Felt a <b>joyous</b> abandon.
pensive	Showing pensive sadness. A <b>pensive</b> mood.
<u>perpetrator</u>	A person who carries out a harmful, illegal, or immoral act. The <b>perpetrators</b> of this horrific crime must be brought to justice.
<u>preoccupied</u>	Having or showing excessive or compulsive concern with something. She seemed a bit <b>preoccupied</b> .

<b><u>prison</u></b>	Imprison. <i>He died in <b>prison</b>.</i>
<b><u>prisoner</u></b>	A person who is confined especially a prisoner of war. <i>200 rebels were taken <b>prisoner</b>.</i>
<b>rapt</b>	Filled with an intense and pleasurable emotion enraptured. <i>The newly chosen minister declared he was <b>rapt</b> with his new portfolio.</i>
<b>rapture</b>	(according to some millenarian teaching) transport (a believer) from earth to heaven at the Second Coming of Christ. <i>The tabloids went into <b>raptures</b> about her.</i>
<b>repatriate</b>	A person who has been repatriated. <i>Foreign firms would be permitted to <b>repatriate</b> all profits.</i>
<b><u>reverie</u></b>	A state of being pleasantly lost in one's thoughts; a daydream. <i>A knock on the door broke her <b>reverie</b>.</i>
<b>solicitous</b>	Characterized by or showing interest or concern. <i>She was always <b>solicitous</b> about the welfare of her students.</i>
<b>thoughtful</b>	Taking heed giving close and thoughtful attention. <i>Brows drawn together in <b>thoughtful</b> consideration.</i>
<b><u>trapped</u></b>	Forced to turn and face attackers. <i>Like a <b>trapped</b> animal.</i>
<b><u>troubled</u></b>	Beset by problems or difficulties. <i><b>Troubled</b> areas.</i>
