## Associations of "Engulfed" (30 Words)

<b>absorb</b>	Take up and reduce the effect or intensity of (sound or an impact). <i>Steroids are <b>absorbed</b> into the bloodstream.</i>
<b>awash</b>	Covered or flooded with water, especially seawater or rain. <i>A rock <b>awash</b> outside the reef entrance.</i>
<a href="#">blade</a>	A cut of beef from the shoulder blade. <i>The Paralympics brought prosthetics such as running <b>blades</b> into the limelight.</i>
<a href="#">cascade</a>	Rush down in big quantities like a cascade. <i>The waterfall raced down in a series of <b>cascades</b>.</i>
<b>deeply</b>	To a great depth; far down or in. <i>She was <b>deeply</b> hurt.</i>
<b>deluge</b>	The biblical Flood (recorded in Genesis 6-8). <i>A <b>deluge</b> of rain hit the plains.</i>
<a href="#">dive</a>	(of prices or profits) drop suddenly. <i>He got into a fight in some <b>dive</b>.</i>
<b>drop</b>	An instance of falling or dropping. <i>He looked ready to <b>drop</b>.</i>
<a href="#">drown</a>	Deliberately kill a person or animal by drowning. <i>The divers saved the <b>drowning</b> child.</i>
<b>enclose</b>	Enclose or enfold completely with or as if with a covering. <i>The open fields in the parish were <b>enclosed</b> in 1808.</i>
<b>engross</b>	Consume all of one’s attention or time. <i>The country had made the best of its position to <b>engross</b> trade.</i>
<b>envelop</b>	Enclose or enfold completely with or as if with a covering. <i>Fog <b>enveloped</b> the house.</i>
<b>focus</b>	Become focussed or come into focus. <i>An opportunity to <b>focus</b> research on the health needs of the population.</i>

<b>immerse</b>	Cause to be immersed. <i>She was still <b>immersed</b> in her thoughts.</i>
<b><u>immersion</u></b>	A method of teaching a foreign language by the exclusive use of that language. <i>A week s <b>immersion</b> in the culinary heritage of Puglia.</i>
<b><u>knife</u></b>	Use a knife on. <i>The victim was <b>knifed</b> to death.</i>
<b><u>occupy</u></b>	Fill or preoccupy the mind. <i>The young prince will soon <b>occupy</b> the throne.</i>
<b><u>overwhelm</u></b>	Give too much of something to; inundate. <i>The Stilton doesn t <b>overwhelm</b> the flavour of the trout.</i>
<b><u>plunge</u></b>	Fall suddenly and uncontrollably. <i>A car swerved to avoid a bus and <b>plunged</b> into a ravine.</i>
<b>sheathe</b>	Enclose with a sheath. <i>Her legs were <b>sheathed</b> in black stockings.</i>
<b>sink</b>	Cause to sink. <i>This pledge could <b>sink</b> the government.</i>
<b><u>submerge</u></b>	Fill or cover completely, usually with water. <i>Houses had been flooded and cars <b>submerged</b>.</i>
<b>submergence</b>	The process or state of being submerged in or covered with water. <i>Total <b>submergence</b> of plants results in heavy crop losses.</i>
<b>submerge</b>	Sink below the surface; go under or as if under water. <i>Pellets were then <b>submersed</b> in agar.</i>
<b><u>surround</u></b>	Surround with a wall in order to fortify. <i>An oak fireplace <b>surround</b>.</i>
<b>swallow</b>	An amount of something swallowed in one action. <i>She <b>swallowed</b> hard sniffing back her tears.</i>
<b><u>sword</u></b>	A weapon with a long metal blade and a hilt with a hand guard, used for thrusting or striking and now typically worn as part of ceremonial dress. <i>Not many perished by the <b>sword</b>.</i>
<b>underwater</b>	(of a loan) having a balance that exceeds the current market value of the loan. <i>They learn to navigate <b>underwater</b> at night.</i>
<b><u>waterfall</u></b>	A cascade of water falling from a height, formed when a river or stream flows over a precipice or steep incline. <i>Each phase of a <b>waterfall</b> project must be complete prior to moving to the next phase.</i>
