<b><a href="#">ecstatic</a></b>	Feeling great rapture or delight. <i><b>Ecstatic</b> fans filled the stadium.</i>
<b>rapt</b>	Filled with an intense and pleasurable emotion enraptured. <i>The newly chosen minister declared he was <b>rapt</b> with his new portfolio.</i>
<b>rapturous</b>	Characterized by, feeling, or expressing great pleasure or enthusiasm. <i>He was greeted with <b>rapturous</b> applause.</i>
<b>rhapsodic</b>	Feeling great rapture or delight.

### Associations of "Enraptured" (30 Words)

<b>beatitude</b>	One of the eight sayings of Jesus at the beginning of the Sermon on the Mount; in Latin each saying begins with `beatus' (blessed). <i>The expression of <b>beatitude</b> the religious sometimes adopt.</i>
<b>blessedness</b>	The state of being blessed with divine favour.

<b>blissful</b>	Extremely happy; full of joy. <i><b>Blissful</b> young lovers.</i>
<b>contentment</b>	A state of happiness and satisfaction. <i>He found <b>contentment</b> in living a simple life in the country.</i>
<b>delight</b>	Take delight in. <i>The little girls squealed with <b>delight</b>.</i>
<b>delighted</b>	Filled with wonder and delight. <i>We were <b>delighted</b> to see her.</i>
<b>ecstasy</b>	A state of being carried away by overwhelming emotion. <i>There was a look of <b>ecstasy</b> on his face.</i>
<b>ecstatic</b>	Involving an experience of mystic self-transcendence. <i>An <b>ecstatic</b> vision of God.</i>
<b>elated</b>	Full of high-spirited delight. <i>Felt <b>elated</b> and excited.</i>
<b>engrossed</b>	Written formally in a large clear script, as a deed or other legal document. <i>That <b>engrossed</b> look or rapt delight.</i>
<b>enjoyable</b>	Affording satisfaction or pleasure. <i>The company was <b>enjoyable</b>.</i>
<b>euphoria</b>	A feeling or state of intense excitement and happiness. <i>In his <b>euphoria</b> he had become convinced he could defeat them.</i>
<b>euphoric</b>	Characterized by or feeling intense excitement and happiness. <i>A <b>euphoric</b> sense of freedom.</i>
<b>exaltation</b>	A flock of larks. <i>The <b>exaltation</b> of Jesus to the Father s right hand.</i>
<b>exultant</b>	Joyful and proud especially because of triumph or success. <i>He waved to the <b>exultant</b> crowds.</i>
<b>exultation</b>	A feeling of extreme joy. <i>She laughs in <b>exultation</b>.</i>
<b>glad</b>	Causing happiness. <i>A <b>glad</b> May morning.</i>
<b>happiness</b>	Emotions experienced when in a state of well-being. <i>Tom s heart swelled with <b>happiness</b>.</i>
<b>happy</b>	Satisfied with the quality or standard of. <i>I m <b>happy</b> with his performance.</i>
<b>joy</b>	A thing that causes joy. <i>You ll get no <b>joy</b> out of her.</i>

<b>joyful</b>	Feeling, expressing, or causing great pleasure and happiness. <i><b>Joyful</b> music.</i>
<b>joyous</b>	Full of happiness and joy. <i>Scenes of <b>joyous</b> celebration.</i>
<b>jubilant</b>	Full of high-spirited delight. <i>A large number of <b>jubilant</b> fans ran on to the pitch.</i>
<b>laughing</b>	Showing or feeling mirth or pleasure or happiness. <i><b>Laughing</b> children.</i>
<b>merry</b>	Offering fun and gaiety. <i>A <b>merry</b> chase.</i>
<b>pleased</b>	Feeling or showing pleasure and satisfaction, especially at an event or a situation. <i>He seemed really <b>pleased</b> that she was there.</i>
<b>rapt</b>	Feeling great rapture or delight. <i>He was <b>rapt</b> on high.</i>
<b>rapture</b>	(according to some millenarian teaching) transport (a believer) from earth to heaven at the Second Coming of Christ. <i>People will be <b>raptured</b> out of automobiles as they are driving along.</i>
<b>rapturous</b>	Feeling great rapture or delight. <i>He was greeted with <b>rapturous</b> applause.</i>
