- Make (someone) wealthy or wealthier.
- Make better or improve in quality.
- Increase the proportion of a particular isotope in (an element), especially that of the isotope U-235 in uranium so as to make it suitable for use in a nuclear reactor or weapon.
- Make wealthy or richer.
- Improve or enhance the quality or value of.
