Definitions of "Enrich" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “enrich” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Increase the nutritive value of (food) by adding vitamins or nutrients.*
- *Make (someone) wealthy or wealthier.*
- *Make better or improve in quality.*
- *Increase the proportion of a particular isotope in (an element), especially that of the isotope U-235 in uranium so as to make it suitable for use in a nuclear reactor or weapon.*
- *Make wealthy or richer.*
- *Improve or enhance the quality or value of.*

Make an addition by combining numbers.

add to

Make an addition by combining numbers.

augment

Enlarge or increase.

*He **augmented** his summer income by painting houses.*

boost

Give a boost to be beneficial to.

*The singer had to be **boosted** onto the stage by a special contraption.*

complement

Make complete or perfect supply what is wanting or form the complement to.

*The proposals **complement** the incentives already available.*

enhance

Intensify, increase, or further improve the quality, value, or extent of.

*His refusal does nothing to **enhance** his reputation.*

fertilize	Provide with fertilizers or add nutrients to. <i>The course fertilized her imagination.</i>
improve	Achieve or produce something better than. <i>Efforts to improve relations between the countries.</i>
make more fertile	Undergo fabrication or creation.
make more nutritious	Give certain properties to something.
make richer	Create or design, often in a certain way.
<u>reinforce</u>	Strengthen (a military force) with additional personnel or equipment. <i>He reinforced the concrete.</i>
supplement	Add as a supplement to what seems insufficient. <i>I looked for a part time job to supplement my income.</i>
<u>upgrade</u>	Give a promotion to or assign to a higher position. <i>The company upgraded their personnel.</i>
vitaminize	Add vitamins to (food). <i>Vitaminized processed foods.</i>

- *Top party members had enriched themselves.*
- *They announced they would resume building the centrifuges that can enrich uranium to weapons-grade strength.*
- *The oil boom enriched a lot of local people.*

- *The experience enriched her understanding.*
- *Enriched foods.*

enhancement	An increase or improvement in quality, value, or extent. <i>The enhancement of civic amenities.</i>
<u>enlarge</u>	Become larger or bigger. <i>Very often a favourite photograph is enlarged and framed.</i>
<u>escalate</u>	Increase rapidly. <i>The price of tickets escalated.</i>
expansion	A discussion that provides additional information. <i>A small expansion of industry.</i>
fertilization	Making fertile as by applying fertilizer or manure.
grow	Become attached by or as if by the process of growth. <i>Entrepreneurs who are struggling to grow their businesses.</i>
improve	Make or become better. <i>I subscribed to two magazines to improve my mind.</i>
increase	A change resulting in an increase. <i>The increase in unemployment.</i>
increment	A regular increase in salary on an incremental scale. <i>All sizes from 4 30 mm in 1 mm increments.</i>
<u>intensify</u>	Become or make more intense. <i>The dispute began to intensify.</i>
<u>modernize</u>	Become technologically advanced. <i>He modernized the health service.</i>
mounting	The action of mounting something. <i>He pulled the curtain rail from its mounting.</i>
promote	Of an additive act as a promoter of a catalyst. <i>She was promoted to General Manager.</i>

promotion	The activity of organizing publicity campaigns. <i>The paper is reaping the rewards of a series of promotions.</i>
raise	Raise from a lower to a higher position. <i>Raise a siege.</i>
<u>refurbish</u>	Renovate and redecorate (something, especially a building). <i>We refurbished the guest wing.</i>
rise	Rise up. <i>Non supervisory staff were given a 5 per cent rise.</i>
<u>surge</u>	(of a rope, chain, or windlass) slip back with a jerk. <i>Flooding caused by tidal surges.</i>
<u>tenfold</u>	Having ten parts or elements. <i>A tenfold increase in the use of insecticides.</i>
<u>upgrade</u>	The property possessed by a slope or surface that rises. <i>I got an upgrade to first class when coach class was full.</i>
<u>uplift</u>	Cause (someone) to feel more cheerful, positive, or optimistic. <i>Music can uplift your spirits.</i>
<u>upsurge</u>	An upward surge in the strength or quantity of something; an increase. <i>An upsurge in vandalism and violent crime.</i>
