accelerate	Move faster. <i>The key question is whether stress accelerates ageing.</i>
advancement	The promotion of a person in rank or status. <i>Opportunities for career advancement.</i>
amplification	The action of increasing the amplitude of an electrical signal or other oscillation. <i>The amplification of radio signals is possible.</i>
augment	Make (something) greater by adding to it; increase. <i>He augmented his summer income by painting houses.</i>
augmentation	The lengthening of the time values of notes in a melodic part. <i>The augmentation of the curriculum with new subjects.</i>
develop	Cause to grow and differentiate in ways conforming to its natural development. <i>A strange closeness developed.</i>
elevate	Raise to a more important or impressive level. <i>She ordered the bishop celebrating Mass in her chapel not to elevate the Host.</i>
enhance	Intensify, increase, or further improve the quality, value, or extent of. <i>This sauce will enhance the flavor of the meat.</i>
enhancement	An increase or improvement in quality, value, or extent. <i>This programme of enhancements will improve the daily experience of passengers.</i>
enlarge	Become larger or bigger. <i>She enlarged the flower beds.</i>
escalate	Increase rapidly. <i>The price of tickets escalated.</i>

expansion	The increase in the volume of fuel on combustion in the cylinder of an engine, or the piston stroke in which this occurs. <i>The book is an expansion of a lecture given last year.</i>
fertilization	Creation by the physical union of male and female gametes; of sperm and ova in an animal or pollen and ovule in a plant.
grow	Cause to grow or develop. <i>Her hair doesn't grow much anymore.</i>
improve	Achieve or produce something better than. <i>They are trying to improve on the tired old style.</i>
increase	A change resulting in an increase. <i>The boss finally increased her salary.</i>
increment	A regular increase in salary on an incremental scale. <i>All sizes from 4 30 mm in 1 mm increments.</i>
<u>intensify</u>	Make more intense, stronger, or more marked. <i>The dispute began to intensify.</i>
<u>modernize</u>	Make repairs, renovations, revisions or adjustments to. <i>He modernized the health service.</i>
mounting	The action of mounting something. <i>He pulled the curtain rail from its mounting.</i>
promote	Of an additive act as a promoter of a catalyst. <i>She was promoted to General Manager.</i>
promotion	Activity that supports or encourages a cause, venture, or aim. <i>The promotion of cultural and racial diversity.</i>
raise	Raise in rank or condition. <i>Raise from the dead.</i>
<u>refurbish</u>	Renovate and redecorate (something, especially a building). <i>We refurbished the guest wing.</i>
rise	Rise to one's feet. <i>The bird has a display flight of steep flapping rises.</i>
<u>surge</u>	See one's performance improve. <i>Sophie felt a surge of anger.</i>
<u>tenfold</u>	Containing ten or ten parts. <i>A tenfold increase in the use of insecticides.</i>
<u>upgrade</u>	An improved or more modern version of something, especially a piece of computing equipment. <i>He will be upgraded from an Undersecretary to a seat at the cabinet table.</i>

uplift

An instance of being raised or increased.

*Mona says the orchestra has **uplifted** her quality of life.*

upsurge

An upward surge in the strength or quantity of something; an increase.

*An **upsurge** in violent crime.*
