<b>degree</b>	A rank in an order of freemasonry. <i>Criminal conduct in the first <b>degree</b>.</i>
<b>diploma</b>	A certificate awarded by an educational establishment to show that someone has successfully completed a course of study.
<b><u>educator</u></b>	Someone who educates young people. <i>The perspective of a professional <b>educator</b>.</i>
<b>enrol</b>	Write the name of (someone) on a list or register. <i>A campaign to <b>enrol</b> more foster carers.</i>
<b>enter</b>	Set out on an enterprise or subject of study. <i><b>Enter</b> an agreement.</i>
<b>entry</b>	An item written or printed in a diary, list, account book, or reference book. <i><b>Entry</b> is open to people of all ages.</i>
<b>grad</b>	A person who has received a degree from a school (high school or college or university).
<b>graduation</b>	The act of arranging in grades. <i>The ruler had 16 <b>graduations</b> per inch.</i>
<b>headmaster</b>	A man who is the head teacher in a school.
<b>homeroom</b>	A classroom in which a group of students assembles daily with the same teacher before dispersing to other classes.
<b><u>library</u></b>	A collection of books and periodicals held in a library. <i>The Institute houses an outstanding <b>library</b> of 35 000 volumes on the fine arts.</i>
<b>matriculate</b>	A person who has matriculated. <i>A total of 123 boys and girls who <b>matriculated</b> last year were registered with his department.</i>
<b>pupil</b>	A person who is taught by another, especially a schoolchild or student in relation to a teacher. <i>They are former <b>pupils</b> of the school.</i>
<b>registration</b>	The series of letters and figures identifying a motor vehicle assigned on registration and displayed on a number plate. <i>Her car <b>registration</b> is H53 UVO.</i>
<b><u>school</u></b>	Send to school educate. <i>He didn't miss a single day of <b>school</b>.</i>
<b>schoolmaster</b>	A male teacher in a school.

<b>semester</b>	Half a year; a period of 6 months. <i>The opening week of Harvard s autumn <b>semester</b>.</i>
<b>student</b>	A learned person (especially in the humanities); someone who by long study has gained mastery in one or more disciplines. <i>A maths <b>student</b>.</i>
<b>studio</b>	A studio flat. <i>A big budget contract with a major <b>studio</b>.</i>
<b>studying</b>	Reading carefully with intent to remember.
<b>teach</b>	A teacher. <i>I ll <b>teach</b> you to throw rocks at my windows.</i>
<b>trainee</b>	A person undergoing training for a particular job or profession. <i><b>Trainee</b> solicitors.</i>
<b>undergraduate</b>	Denoting or relating to an undergraduate. <i>A group of Oxford <b>undergraduates</b>.</i>
<b>valedictorian</b>	The student with the best grades who usually delivers the valedictory address at commencement.
