proceed	Begin a course of action. We <b>proceed</b> ed towards Washington.
result	Produce as a result or residue. Talks in July had <b>result</b> ed in stalemate.
spring	Move rapidly or suddenly from a constrained position by or as if by the action of a spring. We decided to <b>spring</b> a surprise on them.
<u>stem</u>	Remove the stem from. <i>Her aunt and her mother were</i> <b>stem</b> <i>ming currants on the side porch.</i>
