arise	Come into existence; take on form or shape. <i>New difficulties had arisen.</i>
derive	Develop or evolve from a latent or potential state. <i>The word punch derives from the Hindustani pancha.</i>
develop	Cause to grow and differentiate in ways conforming to its natural development. <i>Report the news as it develops.</i>
<u>emanate</u>	Give out or emit (a feeling, quality, or sensation). <i>The proposals emanated from a committee.</i>
<u>emerge</u>	Come out into view, as from concealment. <i>The economy has started to emerge from recession.</i>

evolve	Undergo development or evolution. <i>The domestic dog is thought to have evolved from the wolf.</i>
flow	Fall or flow in a certain way. <i>The crowd flowed out of the stadium.</i>
follow	Choose and follow as of theories ideas policies strategies or plans. <i>She followed dinner with a brandy.</i>
issue	Prepare and issue for public distribution or sale. <i>Exotic smells issued from a nearby building.</i>
proceed	Begin a course of action. <i>We proceeded towards Washington.</i>
result	Produce as a result or residue. <i>Talks in July had resulted in stalemate.</i>
spring	Move rapidly or suddenly from a constrained position by or as if by the action of a spring. <i>We decided to spring a surprise on them.</i>
stem	Remove the stem from. <i>Her aunt and her mother were stemming currants on the side porch.</i>

hound	Used in names of dogfishes e g nurse hound smooth hound. <i>He has a reputation as a publicity hound.</i>
listing	A list or catalogue.
mimesis	The imitative representation of nature and human behavior in art and literature. <i>Culture is organized in terms of mimesis and desire.</i>
obediently	In an obedient manner. <i>The dog had been sitting obediently by her side.</i>
path	The course or direction in which a person or thing is moving. <i>The path continues alongside the river for half a mile.</i>
pursuit	A diversion that occupies one's time and thoughts (usually pleasantly). <i>A whole range of leisure pursuits.</i>
quest	Express the need or desire for; ask for. <i>The animal came questing through the forest.</i>
racetrack	A racecourse.
railroad	Transport by railroad. <i>Railroad the West.</i>
railway	Line that is the commercial organization responsible for operating a system of transportation for trains that pull passengers or freight. <i>The carriage of freight on the railways.</i>
retrace	To go back over again. <i>I wanted to retrace a particular evolutionary pathway.</i>
search	An act of searching for someone or something. <i>The advanced search includes options for sorting by date and specifying the news source.</i>
speeder	A driver who exceeds the safe speed limit.
station	The frequency assigned to a broadcasting station. <i>A research station in the rainforest.</i>
succeed	Attain fame, wealth, or social status. <i>He succeeded to his father s kingdom.</i>

<u>successive</u>	Following one another or following others. <i>They were looking for their fifth successive win.</i>
<u>trace</u>	Discover traces of. <i>There wasn't a trace of evidence for the claim.</i>
track	Make tracks upon. <i>The four running disciplines of track road country and fell.</i>
<u>trail</u>	A trailer for a film or broadcast. <i>Trails of ivy.</i>
<u>traverse</u>	An area of land surveyed with a traverse. <i>A moving catwalk that traversed a vast cavernous space.</i>
vestige	A part or organ of an organism which has become reduced or functionless in the course of evolution. <i>He waited patiently but without a vestige of sympathy.</i>
