<b>following</b>	Immediately following in time or order. <i>The crowd of <b>following</b> cars made the occasion seem like a parade.</i>
<b>hound</b>	Used in names of dogfishes e g nurse hound smooth hound. <i>A <b>hound</b> came running through the trees nose to the ground.</i>
<b>listing</b>	The drawing up of a list.
<b>mimesis</b>	Any disease that shows symptoms characteristic of another disease. <i>Barth has always detached his use of plot from <b>mimesis</b>.</i>
<b>obediently</b>	In a manner that shows willingness to comply with an order or request; submissively. <i><b>Obediently</b> she slipped off her right shoe and stocking.</i>
<b>path</b>	A definition of the order in which an operating system or program searches for a file or executable program. <i>The hurricane demolished houses in its <b>path</b>.</i>
<b>pursuit</b>	The action of pursuing someone or something. <i>The cat crouched in the grass in <b>pursuit</b> of a bird.</i>
<b>quest</b>	A long or arduous search for something. <i>They <b>quest</b> wisdom.</i>
<b>racetrack</b>	A racecourse.
<b>railroad</b>	Transport by railroad. <i>They know I was <b>railroaded</b> and falsely accused.</i>
<b>railway</b>	Line that is the commercial organization responsible for operating a system of transportation for trains that pull passengers or freight. <i>The carriage of freight on the <b>railways</b>.</i>
<b>retrace</b>	Discover and follow (a route taken by someone else). <i>He began to <b>retrace</b> his steps to the station car park.</i>
<b>search</b>	An act of searching for someone or something. <i>The guards <b>searched</b> him for weapons.</i>
<b>speeder</b>	A driver who exceeds the safe speed limit.
<b>station</b>	A bus or coach station. <i>Married above her <b>station</b>.</i>

<b>succeed</b>	Achieve the desired aim or result. <i>The management and business skills you need to <b>succeed</b>.</i>
<b><u>successive</u></b>	Following one another or following others. <i>They were looking for their fifth <b>successive</b> win.</i>
<b><u>trace</u></b>	Discover traces of. <i>The article <b>traces</b> out some of the connections between education qualifications and the labour market.</i>
<b>track</b>	Make tracks upon. <i>The title <b>track</b> of the album.</i>
<b><u>trail</u></b>	A trailer for a film or broadcast. <i><b>Trails</b> of ivy.</i>
<b><u>traverse</u></b>	An area of land surveyed with a traverse. <i>High level walks in the Dolomites often involve steep exposed climbs <b>traverses</b> and descents.</i>
<b>vestige</b>	The smallest amount. <i>The last <b>vestiges</b> of colonialism.</i>
