follow	Choose and follow as of theories ideas policies strategies or plans. <i>Tuesday always follows Monday.</i>
following	Immediately following in time or order. <i>The crowd of following cars made the occasion seem like a parade.</i>
hound	Used in names of dogfishes e g nurse hound smooth hound. <i>A hound came running through the trees nose to the ground.</i>
listing	The drawing up of a list.
mimesis	Any disease that shows symptoms characteristic of another disease. <i>Barth has always detached his use of plot from mimesis.</i>
obediently	In a manner that shows willingness to comply with an order or request; submissively. <i>Obediently she slipped off her right shoe and stocking.</i>
path	A definition of the order in which an operating system or program searches for a file or executable program. <i>The hurricane demolished houses in its path.</i>
pursuit	The action of pursuing someone or something. <i>The cat crouched in the grass in pursuit of a bird.</i>
quest	A long or arduous search for something. <i>They quest wisdom.</i>
racetrack	A racecourse.
railroad	Transport by railroad. <i>They know I was railroaded and falsely accused.</i>
railway	Line that is the commercial organization responsible for operating a system of transportation for trains that pull passengers or freight. <i>The carriage of freight on the railways.</i>
retrace	Discover and follow (a route taken by someone else). <i>He began to retrace his steps to the station car park.</i>
search	An act of searching for someone or something. <i>The guards searched him for weapons.</i>
speeder	A driver who exceeds the safe speed limit.
station	A bus or coach station. <i>Married above her station.</i>

succeed	Achieve the desired aim or result. <i>The management and business skills you need to succeed.</i>
<u>successive</u>	Following one another or following others. <i>They were looking for their fifth successive win.</i>
<u>trace</u>	Discover traces of. <i>The article traces out some of the connections between education qualifications and the labour market.</i>
track	Make tracks upon. <i>The title track of the album.</i>
<u>trail</u>	A trailer for a film or broadcast. <i>Trails of ivy.</i>
<u>traverse</u>	An area of land surveyed with a traverse. <i>High level walks in the Dolomites often involve steep exposed climbs traverses and descents.</i>
vestige	The smallest amount. <i>The last vestiges of colonialism.</i>
