## Associations of "Ensuing" (30 Words)

<b>accompanying</b>	Following or accompanying as a consequence. <i>The <b>accompanying</b> documentation.</i>
<b>after</b>	At a later or future time afterwards. <i>The week <b>after</b> I was back at school.</i>
<b><u>afterward</u></b>	Happening at a time subsequent to a reference time. <i>It didn't happen until <b>afterward</b>.</i>
<b><u>afterwards</u></b>	At a later or future time. <i>The offender was arrested shortly <b>afterwards</b>.</i>
<b>coeval</b>	Of the same period. <i>Like so many of his <b>coevals</b> he yearned for stability.</i>
<b><u>concomitant</u></b>	Following or accompanying as a consequence. <i>He sought promotion without the necessary <b>concomitant</b> of hard work.</i>
<b><u>contemporary</u></b>	A person of roughly the same age as another. <i>The tension and complexities of our <b>contemporary</b> society.</i>
<b>hereafter</b>	In a future life or state. <i>This court is in no way prejudging any such defence which may <b>hereafter</b> be raised.</i>
<b>hitherto</b>	Used in negative statement to describe a situation that has existed up to this point or up to the present time. <i><b>Hitherto</b> part of French West Africa Benin achieved independence in 1960.</i>
<b>later</b>	Comparative of the adverb `late. <i><b>Later</b> on it will be easier.</i>
<b><u>next</u></b>	The next person or thing. <i>Our <b>next</b> president.</i>
<b>now</b>	In the immediate past. <i>I'd rather do it <b>now</b> than leave it till later.</i>

<b>passing</b>	In sport the action of passing a ball to another team member. <i>A <b>passing</b> glance.</i>
<b>period</b>	The interval between successive equal values of a periodic function. <i>The ale will be available for a limited <b>period</b>.</i>
<b>recent</b>	Approximately the last 10,000 years. <i>His <b>recent</b> visit to Britain.</i>
<b>recently</b>	At a recent time; not long ago. <i>Until <b>recently</b> we had a female doctor.</i>
<b>retrospective</b>	An exhibition or compilation showing the development of an artist's work over a period of time. <i><b>Retrospective</b> pay awards.</i>
<b>sequent</b>	Occurring with or following as a consequence. <i>Some of the inferences are not <b>sequent</b> on the premises.</i>
<b>shortly</b>	In a short time; soon. <i>Do you like cricket I do not she said <b>shortly</b>.</i>
<b>simultaneous</b>	Occurring, operating, or done at the same time. <i><b>Simultaneous</b> translation.</i>
<b>soon</b>	Early. <i>He ll be home <b>soon</b>.</i>
<b>subsequent</b>	Coming after something in time; following. <i>The theory was developed <b>subsequent</b> to the earthquake of 1906.</i>
<b>subsequently</b>	Happening at a time subsequent to a reference time. <i>The work was accepted for inclusion in the Paris Salon of 1880 and was <b>subsequently</b> sold to an important collector.</i>
<b>successor</b>	A person who follows next in order. <i>He was President Lincoln s <b>successor</b>.</i>
<b>sync</b>	Synchronize. <i>Let s <b>synchronize</b> our efforts.</i>
<b>synchronize</b>	Adjust (a clock or watch) to show the same time as another. <i><b>Synchronize</b> this film.</i>
<b>synchronous</b>	Making or denoting an orbit around the earth or another celestial body in which one revolution is completed in the period taken for the body to rotate about its axis. <i>Glaciations were approximately <b>synchronous</b> in both hemispheres.</i>
<b>time</b>	One s lifetime. <i><b>Time</b> the clock.</i>

The choice, judgement, or control of when something should be done.

**year**

A year regarded in terms of the quality of something produced.  
*She is 4 **years** old.*
