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Associations of "Ensuing" (30 Words)

accompanying	Following or accompanying as a consequence. <i>The accompanying documentation.</i>
after	At a later or future time afterwards. <i>The week after I was back at school.</i>
afterward	Happening at a time subsequent to a reference time. <i>It didn't happen until afterward.</i>
afterwards	At a later or future time. <i>The offender was arrested shortly afterwards.</i>
coeval	Of the same period. <i>Like so many of his coevals he yearned for stability.</i>
concomitant	Following or accompanying as a consequence. <i>He sought promotion without the necessary concomitant of hard work.</i>
contemporary	A person of roughly the same age as another. <i>The tension and complexities of our contemporary society.</i>
hereafter	In a future life or state. <i>This court is in no way prejudging any such defence which may hereafter be raised.</i>
hitherto	Used in negative statement to describe a situation that has existed up to this point or up to the present time. <i>Hitherto part of French West Africa Benin achieved independence in 1960.</i>
later	Comparative of the adverb `late. <i>Later on it will be easier.</i>
next	The next person or thing. <i>Our next president.</i>
now	In the immediate past. <i>I'd rather do it now than leave it till later.</i>

passing	In sport the action of passing a ball to another team member. <i>A passing glance.</i>
period	The interval between successive equal values of a periodic function. <i>The ale will be available for a limited period.</i>
recent	Approximately the last 10,000 years. <i>His recent visit to Britain.</i>
recently	At a recent time; not long ago. <i>Until recently we had a female doctor.</i>
retrospective	An exhibition or compilation showing the development of an artist's work over a period of time. <i>Retrospective pay awards.</i>
sequent	Occurring with or following as a consequence. <i>Some of the inferences are not sequent on the premises.</i>
<u>shortly</u>	In a short time; soon. <i>Do you like cricket I do not she said shortly.</i>
<u>simultaneous</u>	Occurring, operating, or done at the same time. <i>Simultaneous translation.</i>
<u>soon</u>	Early. <i>He ll be home soon.</i>
<u>subsequent</u>	Coming after something in time; following. <i>The theory was developed subsequent to the earthquake of 1906.</i>
subsequently	Happening at a time subsequent to a reference time. <i>The work was accepted for inclusion in the Paris Salon of 1880 and was subsequently sold to an important collector.</i>
successor	A person who follows next in order. <i>He was President Lincoln s successor.</i>
<u>sync</u>	Synchronize. <i>Let s synchronize our efforts.</i>
<u>synchronize</u>	Adjust (a clock or watch) to show the same time as another. <i>Synchronize this film.</i>
synchronous	Making or denoting an orbit around the earth or another celestial body in which one revolution is completed in the period taken for the body to rotate about its axis. <i>Glaciations were approximately synchronous in both hemispheres.</i>
time	One s lifetime. <i>Time the clock.</i>

timing

The choice, judgement, or control of when something should be done.

*One of the secrets of cricket is good **timing**.*

year

A year regarded in terms of the quality of something produced.

*She is 4 **years** old.*
