mesmerize	Attract strongly, as if with a magnet. They were mesmerize d by his story.
narcissist	A person who has an excessive interest in or admiration of themselves. <i>Narcissists preening themselves in front of the mirror.</i>
<u>paralyzed</u>	Affected with paralysis.
portal	A website or web page providing access or links to other sites. <i>The portals of heaven.</i>
<u>seduction</u>	Enticing someone astray from right behavior. If seduction doesn t work she can play on his sympathy.
spellbind	To render motionless, as with a fixed stare or by arousing terror or awe. The singer held the audience spellbound.
<u>tempting</u>	Very pleasantly inviting. A tempting financial offer.
<u>trance</u>	Put into a trance. She s been trance d and may need waking.
wile	The use of tricks to deceive someone (usually to extract money from them. <i>The gang had played monopoly as they wiled away the hours.</i>
